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REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

March 25th - April 11th, 2002

FALL 2002

All currently registered students who expect to return to CSB/SJU this Fall must complete advance registration by April 11th. Please follow these instructions carefully, for proper registration is your responsibility. If you have any questions about registration, call the Registrar's Office at 5260 (CSB) or 3396 (SJU).

STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER ONLY IF THEY HAVE:

- Met with their advisor to obtain their Label with Registration PIN #
- Settled all current charges with the Student Accounts Office
- Been accepted by a department (unless they are a first-year student)
- Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
- Have an active Network account

We strongly urge you to meet with your advisor early and enter your registration on WEBSTER on the date listed on your PIN Label. **Registration is on-line, and delaying your registration will affect course selection.**

Students who are ineligible to register for any of these reasons may register on WEBSTER after they have cleared all registration holds.

Please note that registration for ILPs (Individualized Learning Projects) and for special programs (Tri-College Exchange, Internships, etc.) requires your submission of special forms available from the Registrar's Office. Registration for Internships (8 credits or more) are due the first day of classes.

REGISTRATION ADJUSTMENTS

Registration adjustments (Drop/Add) can be done on WEBSTER through Sept. 2nd. **You will need your Registration PIN# that you received from your Advisor.** After this date, to drop a course, students can come to the Registrar's Office at SJU, Quad 161 or at CSB, Academic Services Building, 208.

Listings of canceled or closed courses will be electronically updated on the Class Schedule Information on WEBSTER. Students should use WEBSTER to check whether a space has become available in a course that was previously closed. Courses may be added through the first 4 class days of the semester.

If a course is closed, check whether there are any other sections of the same course that have spaces available in them and register for an alternate section. If this option is not available to you, consider alternate courses and select among these and register accordingly. Your advisor is a good resource to help determine an appropriate alternate. In some cases, it may be appropriate for the department chair or instructor to "override" a student beyond the course limit. Override registrations are completed by the student presenting a signed (department chair or instructor, as appropriate) Drop/Add card to the Registrar's Office.

We also ask that you use the "Request for Additional Course Spaces" menu item on WEBSTER registration to report a course that you wished to take but were unable to enroll in any section of. Your reporting this will help the colleges plan for possible limit changes or additional sections of the course-both for this semester and for future semesters. Please do not report a course if you were able to register for an alternate section of the same course. This request DOES NOT place you on a waiting list for the course.

REGISTRATION PRIORITY AND COURSE SELECTION

Registration priority is based first on class standing, then on the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Students who are studying abroad are given priority within their class. Seniors are assigned courses first, then juniors, sophomores and first-year students. For Fall Semester registration, the lowest (0000) four digits have the highest priority. You are encouraged to keep these priorities in mind when you develop your course requests. **WEBSTER will immediately respond to your course selection by indicating Enrolled or Closed.**

Instructions for Using WEBSTER

AT ANY NETWORKED PC:

Log on to the PC (your username and password)
Click on the START button
Select NETWORK PROGRAMS
Select INTERNET BROWSERS
Click on INTERNET EXPLORER or NETSCAPE
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>
The CSB/SJU HOMEPAGE displays

FROM OTHER PC'S THAT HAVE ACCESS TO A WEB BROWSER:

Sign on as you normally would, then
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>
The CSB/SJU HOMEPAGE displays

- Click on **"Inside CSB/SJU"**. Then click on the word **"Student Links"** and click on **"WEBSTER"** on the left hand side under **"ACADEMIC"**
- Click on the **Fall term ONLINE Registration** icon
- **At the Registration Login Screen**, Click on the box and **Enter your Student ID # (with no spaces or dashes) & Enter your PIN #** in the space labeled "PIN" (**PIN # is on the PIN Label you received from your advisor - Do not use your WSC**)
Click on the **Login** button **once**
- **At the Registration Login Verification Screen**
Click on the box and **Enter your PIN# again** & then click on the **Login** button **once**
- Click on **Fall Term Registration** – from the Main Registration Menu
Click on **Fall 2002** and then click on the **Select Term** button
- **To Enter your Fall Term Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Enter the 5 digit Call #'s for all of the courses you want to register for - call numbers are listed next to the course number in the Spring Class Schedule Booklet. Click on **Submit Registration** button - **you must click on this for your registration to be entered into the computer system.** If there is space in the courses you selected and if you meet the necessary prerequisites, the screen will display **"Registered Successfully"**. It will also display the Course ID, Credits and Title of the courses that you have registered for. If a class is closed or you do not meet the prerequisite the screen will display **"Class Registration failed with error"** and a reason for the error.
- **To change the credits on a Variable Credit Course:**
Click on **Change Course Credit**
Enter the number of credits in the box (select from the range displayed) & click on **Submit Changes**
- **To check course availability:**
Click on **Look-up Class to Add**
Click on the name of the **Subject** and Click on **Select Subject** button
Click on the **Department and Course Number** and Click on **Select Course** button
This will display all the sections of that course, and under 'status' it will state 'open' or 'closed'
(Note: You may **not** be able to register for some courses that are 'open' because you do not meet the prerequisite or quota restrictions for that course.)
- **To request a course that your were unable to enroll in any section of:**
Click on **Request for Additional Course Spaces** - from Student Registration Menu
Enter the **5 digit Call #'s of the course(s) you were not able to enroll in** (this request DOES NOT place you on a wait list for the course).
Click on **Submit**
The screen will display "Courses Requested" or "Course Request Failed" and a reason
- **To change your Fall Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Click on the **down arrow in the Action Box** of the course you want to Drop
Click on **DROP**
Under **ADD Class** fill in the **Call #** of the new course you want to Add
Click on **Submit Registration Button** - **this will drop your course and add a new one at the same time. Keep your Registration PIN # - you may Drop/Add for Fall semester until September 2nd.**
- **To send a copy of your Course Requests to the printer:**
Click on **File** from Menu Bar
Select **Print** & Click on **OK**
- **To sign off:**
Click on **Exit WEBSTER**
Exit the CSB/SJU Homepage
Exit Netscape
Log-off the PC

PLEASE NOTE:

If you have trouble operating the computer terminal when attempting to enter your Fall Term registration, please **(1) ask for assistance from the Computer access student employee, or (2) contact the Office of the Registrar.** The students who staff the Access Areas have been trained on the use of WEBSTER and are ready to respond to questions you may have while entering your registration.

DROP/ADD on WEBSTER

If you would like to drop and add courses for Fall Term 2002 you may do this through WEBSTER until September 2nd. Please keep your Registration PIN #, you will need this to Drop/Add on WEBSTER. After this date you will need to drop and add courses in the Registrar's Office.

OBTAINING A NETWORK ACCOUNT

All students must have a NETWORK account to use WEBSTER from the Network PC's on campus. Most of you will already have an account, which you may use for many other functions besides course registration. If you do not have a Network account--or have forgotten your password or how to sign on--please follow these simple steps to obtain your Network account:

- Step #1:** Go the Computing Center at SJU, Quad 084, from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm
- Step #2:** Identify yourself as needing a Network account.
- Step #3:** Activate your account on one of the PC's in the computing center

PROBLEMS -- Discussed below are some common problems we expect some of you may encounter, and how you may solve them.

- **Your PIN # doesn't work.**
Solution: Re-check your label and carefully re-enter the PIN #. You may have to Exit WEBSTER completely and logon again. **YOUR PIN# for registration is not the same as your WSC (Webster Security Code) that you use to access Student Information on WEBSTER**
Please note: the PIN # is not displayed (for security reasons) as you enter it on the computer.
- **You lost your PIN #.**
Solution: Contact your Advisor to get your Pin Number again, or bring your Advisor's signature to the Registrar's Office. (PIN #'s cannot be obtained in the Computer Access Areas)
- **You entered the wrong Call #.**
Solution: WEBSTER allows you to make changes to your registration. See the section on changing your fall registration in the "Instructions for using WEBSTER". You may make changes on WEBSTER through September 2nd.
- **While using WEBSTER it displays: "This session for your Login has expired".**
Solution: WEBSTER is programmed to Log off of the Registration Screen if you **leave the screen idle for more than 2 minutes**. If this should this happen, simply sign on again. To do so, click on WEBSTER and then click on the Fall Registration icon and start over.
- **WEBSTER shows the status of a course as 'open' but it will not permit you to register for the course.**
Solution: You may not meet the prerequisites or quota restrictions for that course. Check the notes in the class schedule under that course or contact the Registrar's Office.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

ACADEMIC ADVISING

After receiving this Class Schedule booklet, visit your academic advisor to arrange a program of classes for next term, and have him or her place your PIN label on the Class Request Worksheet located on the back page of your Fall 2002 Class Schedule Booklet.

If you intend to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. Overloads may be attempted only by students in good academic standing, and overloads of 21 or more credits require the student to see the Academic Advising Office.

AUDITING

Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) should indicate their intent when registering for the course, or complete a Drop/Add card and file it with the Registrar during the first week of class. Auditors are expected to attend all regular classes, but they are not required to take final exams. A student who first registers for credit may change to auditor status any time during the first month of class. A student who first enrolls for auditor status may change to credit status only during the first week of class. Courses audited are not included in determining the total credits earned; however, the credit value of any course audited is computed in the assessment of tuition.

ADDING A CLASS

Monday, September 2nd is the last day you may ADD a full-term course to your program, unless the course's first meeting is scheduled after September 2nd. No student may enroll for a full-term course after the second scheduled meeting without the instructor's consent.

DROPPING A CLASS

- **Sept. 2nd** Last day to Add a full term course to your schedule
- **Sept. 20th** Last day to receive a permanent drop on your schedule
- **Nov. 13th** Last day to receive a "W" on your transcript. If you withdraw after this date, your instructor will assign you an "F" at the end of the semester.

For courses scheduled for less than a full term, withdrawal during the first third of the course will result in no record entry; during the second third, a W entry; during the final third, a failure.

EXEMPTION/SUBSTITUTION

In exceptional circumstances students may petition for exemption/substitution from specific academic regulations. Forms for requesting an exemption/substitution are available from the Registrar's Office. Students should first consult with their academic advisor, whose signature on the exemption/substitution form represents a recommendation that the request be considered favorably by the approving official. Department chairs are the approving officials for exemptions/substitutions from requirements within majors and minors. Exemptions/substitutions from academic regulations beyond major and minor fields require the approval of the academic dean of the student's college. Requests for these non-departmental exemptions/substitutions should be directed to the Academic Advising Offices. The guiding principle in considering requests for any exemption is fidelity to the academic standards of the colleges.

INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PROJECTS

The guidelines and application forms for Individual Learning Projects, sometimes called Independent Study, are available in the Registrar's Office. If you are planning an ILP for Fall term, please consult these guidelines. Remember, only 4 credits of ILP per term are allowed. You may indicate your intent to register for an ILP by requesting DNA 271 01A Call #10358, or DNA 371-01A, Call #10359 on WEBSTER. First-year students are not eligible for ILPs.

POLICY ON INCOMPLETE GRADE

The policy concerning the temporary grade Incomplete (I) includes the following points:

When circumstances warrant, instructors may allow some delay in the completion of course work. Such extensions shall not extend beyond the close of the following regular (fall or spring) semester, and earlier limits may be set at the discretion of the instructor.

The instructor must report on the official grade roster the grade "I" followed by the approximate grade the student will receive if the course work is not complete by the end of the following semester (e.g., IF, or IC, or IB). That grade will be used in the computation of grade point averages until the Incomplete is removed.

If by the end of the following semester the instructor reports a single final grade to the Registrar, that grade will replace the I/GRADE, the Incomplete will be removed, and averages recomputed accordingly. Otherwise the provisional grade that was assigned with the "I" will become a permanent part of the transcript.

Exceptions to the above may be granted only by the written permission of the appropriate Academic Dean. Such exceptions will ordinarily be granted only in cases of medical disability or problems of comparable seriousness.

Degree candidates are cautioned that failure to have all degree requirements satisfied (including removal of Incomplete grades in courses needed for graduation) by the reasonable dates set by the Registrar will necessarily result in postponement of their graduation.

INTERNSHIPS

All CSB/SJU students who plan to do an Internship for 8 or more credits during the Summer or Spring of 2003 must enroll in the Pre-Internship Seminar. The September Pre-Internship Seminar--open to juniors and seniors only--meets during A mod, 8:00 am at SJU, or 2:40 pm at CSB.

The Pre-Internship Seminar is for no credit. If you wish to sign up for the seminar or if you have questions about other options, contact the Internship Office, Academic Services Building, phone 5799. **ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND TWO ADDITIONAL SESSIONS: 1) LEGAL ISSUES OF INTERNSHIPS AND 2) REGISTRATION AND REQUIREMENTS. CHECK WITH THE INTERNSHIP OFFICE FOR EXACT DATES.** The last day to register for a Fall Internship is September 2nd. You may indicate your intent to register for an Internship by requesting DNA 397-01A, Call #10360 through WEBSTER.

SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

All Internships which take place during the summer must be registered under the Summer term rather than under either the preceding Spring semester or the following Fall semester. This policy will be strictly enforced for the 2002 Summer.

The last day to register for a Summer Internship is Friday, May 10th. **Registration after this date requires approval of the Academic Dean.** You must have taken the Pre-internship seminar. If you have not done so contact Julie Christle, phone 5799 for information on alternative meetings.

Please contact Jill Farry, Director of Internships (Academic Services Center, Phone 5799), for information regarding special tuition structures for Summer Internships.

ON TRACK

Advisors will have access to their advisees' **On Track** advising aid through WEB for Faculty or the BARRY Advising System. Please make an appointment to meet with your advisor early to review your academic progress and select your Fall coursework. Remember, all students **MUST** see their advisor to receive their WEBSTER Registration PIN # Label.

OVERLOAD

If you plan to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. The overload tuition fee is estimated at \$500.00 per credit over 18. Students whose cumulative grade point average is below 2.00 may not register for an overload. Students in good academic standing (GPA above 2.00) may register for a maximum of 1 overload credit (19 credits overall) without permission. Credit totals of 20 or more require the student to see the Academic Advising Office. The WEBSTER registration system will not allow you to register for more than 19 credits.

REPEATING A COURSE

A course that has been failed may be repeated for credit. Courses that have been passed may not be repeated for credit. They may, however, be repeated for additional honor points. The original grade is not removed when the course is repeated and credit for a course can be earned only once. The higher grade is computed in the GPA. If you are registering for a course that you are repeating you **MUST** notify the Registrar's Office.

STUDENT TEACHING

Students registering for student teaching (EDUC 361, 362, 363) in their 9th (or greater) semester as a full-time student at CSB/SJU will be billed at ½ the regular tuition rate for that semester. These students will also not be charged the student activity fee, technology fee, and campus center fee

for that semester. Institutional gift aid (scholarships/grants) will not be available to these students.

STUDY ABROAD

CSB and SJU offer a number of group overseas study programs. Students who plan to enroll in one of these programs should contact the International Studies Office, QUAD 128 at SJU. Students who are considering enrolling in coursework offered abroad by another institution (Consortium/External Study Abroad) should contact the International Education Office or the Registrar's Office, for information on transfer of credits. Students who register for SA 372, Consortium/External Study Abroad, will be billed a \$175 fee.

S/U REGISTRATION

Arrangements for this non-honor point grading option should be made with your professor at the **beginning** of the course. Remember that undergraduates are limited in the number and types of courses they may take for the grade S (Satisfactory). See the Catalog for specific rules. First-year students may not take the S/U option except for a course with only S/U grades available. The grade S, once turned in by the instructor, is **NOT SUBJECT TO LATER CHANGE**.

Grading options are listed in the Class Schedule as either GRADING OPTION A-F REQUIRED or GRADING OPTION S-U REQUIRED. If neither of these is listed, the instructor will permit eligible students to choose either option by the date the instructor specifies at the beginning of the course. Once you have chosen, you may not request that the S/U be changed to an honor point grade.

If coursework grades average below a C under the S/U option, the grade U (Unsatisfactory) will be given with no credit earned.

TRI-COLLEGE EXCHANGE

The College of Saint Benedict, Saint John's University, and Saint Cloud State University have an agreement that encourages regular full-time undergraduate students to take courses on any of the three campuses. If you are interested in taking courses at Saint Cloud State, you can pick up a copy of their Class Schedule and a registration application at the Registrar's Office. If a course seems suitable for your program of studies, see your advisor for permission to register. To register, file the approved application with the Registrar's Office at the St. John's campus before August 21st. The course will be added to your Fall 2002 Student Detail Schedule, if space is available.

CSB/SJU students will be billed tuition, and other fees, at CSB/SJU rates. If a student is not registered for more than 18 total credits, there will ordinarily be no additional charge. For credits over 18, an additional tuition charge of \$500.00 (estimate), will be made for each additional semester credit hour.

If you have any questions about Tri-College Exchange and the suitability of SCSU courses toward your degree program, see Jane Simon in the Registrar's Office, QUAD 161.

TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

Current students may request an unofficial copy of their transcript at no charge from the Registrar's Office. Official transcript requests must be submitted in writing to the Registrar's Office and may be picked up at the Registrar's Office (or we can mail them for you) 2-3 working days after the request is made, except during the first and last week of each term.

Former students may request a transcript copy for \$3.00 per transcript. The fee for faxing a transcript will be \$3.00 per transcript. If the transcript is faxed outside the U.S. the fee will be a minimum of \$5.00. All transcript requests must be submitted in writing via mail or fax and payment must accompany the order.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COLLEGE

Complete withdrawal from all of your courses during the term must be initiated with your Residential Director at CSB, Mary Commons 221 or the Residential Life Office, Sexton 127 at SJU. If you withdraw by September 20th, no official record of your registration for that term will be made. If you withdraw between September 23rd and November 13th, the mark "W" will appear behind that term's courses on your transcript. If you withdraw after November 13th, all courses for that term will be followed by the grade of "F". If you decide to withdraw after the term ends, you **MUST** notify the office mentioned above.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL MINNESOTA STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE MINNESOTA GRANT PROGRAM:

You must register for a minimum of 15 credits each semester to receive a Minnesota Grant at the full-time student rate. Students who register for 12-14 credits may still receive a Minnesota Grant but the award amount will be substantially reduced. Please direct any questions to the Financial Aid Office at CSB or SJU. (For all other aid programs, 12 credits is still considered full-time.)

Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for their final exam

The academic calendar concludes each semester with a one-day study and four-day test cycle. Faculty may administer final exams for their classes only during the exam periods officially scheduled by the Registrar's Office. Cumulative final examinations may not be given during the regularly scheduled class days of the semester. If there is to be a cumulative final exam in a course, all exams given during the semester must be returned for student review by the last scheduled day of class.

Instructors of each full-term course are expected to announce at the beginning of the course whether a written two-hour final examination will be given. Such an exam will be administered during the four-day test cycle according to the schedule above. Note that a class is assigned a test time and day in the schedule according to the cycle and time period it meets during the semester. Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for a final exam.

One period has been reserved on each of the four test days for the administration of a common exam for multiple-section courses who so desire. A list of such courses, and their exam times, will be announced this fall. The legend, MS, in the accompanying chart signifies times set aside for these multi-section common exams.

FALL 2002 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BIOLOGY

BIOL 325: Human Anatomy and Physiology I

Integrated study of cells, tissues, organs, and systems of the human body, with emphasis placed on structure-function relationships. Major concepts stressed are how function at the cellular level governs events observable at the tissue, organ, or systemic tier, and physiological mechanism necessary for homeostasis. Topics covered include excitable tissue, skeletal system, nervous system, muscular system, and endocrine system. Laboratory component involves dissection exercises, study of human models, and inquiry-based investigations of muscle physiology and nervous system function.

The main objective of this course is to give students an understanding of cellular processes essential for systems/organism function, placed in context of the structure of the human body. The concept of homeostasis will be stressed throughout in an attempt to familiarize students with importance of an overall body balance and cellular/systemic mechanisms that maintain it within narrow limits. For example, we will examine basic cellular processes such as nerve and muscle excitability, and the systemic processes of neural integration, skeletal muscle physiology, and interactions of hormones of several endocrine glands. At the same time we will also study anatomical properties and relationships of tissues and organs that make the above functions possible.

The course will also encourage students to develop research skills by having them conduct a series of inquiry-based labs that will prepare them for an extensive independent research experience in Biology 326. Besides just learning basic procedures and protocols of a physiology lab, students will plan their experiments, elaborate and test hypotheses, and spend considerable time presenting and analyzing their results in written form.

COMMUNICATION

COMM 383-01A & 02A: Topic: Media Theories (HMU pending)

Katie Johnson

This course examines the historical evolution of theories that have attempted to address important questions about the role of media in society. Students will learn to identify different theoretical paradigms and core paradigm assumptions. Students will learn to recognize the influence of specific socio-historical contexts in the development of different media theories. Students will learn to characterize and critique specific media theories. Finally, students will be able to identify and assess the link between theory and policy implications associated with contemporary issues of media and society.

PREREQUISITE: COMM 103 Mass Media and Society
Preference to COMM majors

COMM 383-03A & 04A: Topic: Mass Media and Children

Erin Szabo

The goal of this course is for students to gain an understanding of the use and effects of mass media in children's lives.

Anxiety surrounds the topic of children as media consumers. In this course, we will examine the social psychological context of children and media consumption, through the merging of scholarship from child psychology and media effects. Through readings, discussions and films, we will look at such topics as children's cognitive ability, age differences in the understanding and comprehension of television messages, individual differences that make media effects more likely, and how media effects occur. Further, we'll assess both intended and beneficial effects of media consumption as well as unintended and potentially harmful effects. This class will employ a social scientific approach to exploring the question of media effects, with representative research being read and discussed.

The objectives of the course are to provide students with an understanding of the theories and research that inform our knowledge of the effects of mass media on children; to assist students in acquiring the ability to apply theories of media effects to current issues involving children; to enhance students' critical reasoning and use of social scientific evidence to support conclusions about the effects of mass media; and to assist students in becoming more critical and educated media consumers.

PREREQUISITE: COMM 103

COURSES OF THE COLLEGE

COLG 105: Special Topics: EMT Basic

This course covers basic minimal emergency care required to work on an ambulance or first responder squad throughout the 50 states in the U.S. The course offers basic to more advanced techniques and principles of pre-hospital; emergency care. Students must be at least eighteen years old to take the National and State Certification exams. Students who have been convicted of a felony should contact the course coordinator.

The student will be evaluated by the instructor for passing of the practical portions of the class, according to the standards in the test, handouts, and lecture. There are several quizzes throughout the class and a final written and practical test, minimum passing score will be 80%. Must take and pass National and State EMT exams to earn passing grade in the course.

- **Permission of the instructor is required.** Obtain drop/add card from the Registrar's Office & see Dr. Hafner for signature/permission.
- Sophomores and juniors only and meeting all requirements as listed.
- Current certification in "CPR for the Professional Rescuer" Hepatitis B immunization encouraged prior to beginning the course.
- Mantoux or other TB test within 6 months of course
- Students must complete online form and submit this information to the SJU Health Center

FEES: Approximately \$600. (Note: This fee is based on a minimum enrollment of 15.) \$15.00 money order to the National Registry for exam.

CORE 369-71A: Topic: Holocaust

Daniel McKanan

This course is cross-listed with PCST 368-71A. See description under PCST 368

CORE - SENIOR SEMINARS

SENIOR SEMINAR - A Core Curriculum Requirement

"The traditions of the liberal arts and the Benedictine character of our two colleges emphasize the need to develop in our students an ability to lead responsible lives in a contemporary world. This concern has always been a central element in notions about striving for a 'good life,' leading a life of civic responsibility, a life of personal integration, a life of 'wholeness.' At the junior/senior level of the curriculum, this objective implies that explicit and focused attention be paid to developing the ability to make good moral judgments on issues that affect our lives. Developing this ability is, then, the goal of this program. By 'good moral judgments' we understand choices which are consciously elected and defensively maintained."

A second goal is to enhance, "the ability of students to think well about problems that resist easy solutions, problems that call for combining many separate resources and skills, both intellectual and personal."

"The aim of the program is to develop these skills:

- An understanding of the role that empirical information plays in justifying moral judgment
- An ability to sort relevant from irrelevant data
- An understanding of relationships
- An ability to assess the cogency of arguments
- An appreciation of the implications of claims
- An ability to analyze concepts
- An appreciation of and ability to use contextual thinking
- An ability to imagine vividly the impact of events and decisions upon the needs, perceptions, and desires of others
- An appreciation of emotions in the decision making process
- An ability to identify and assess normative components of issues
- An ability to clarify the relationship between an issue and one's own values"

"Issues and concerns around and through which these abilities are developed must be pertinent and persistent in the lives of both students and professors. They should be issues which broaden and deepen the scope of our concern, that increase our consciousness of connections

between our lives and the rest of the world." Taken from *Exploring the Human Condition*.

CORE 390-01A: Justice I the Twenty-First Century

Daniel Finn 1-3-5 / 9:40-10:50 / SJU

This course will examine in detail five rival understandings of justice prevalent in debates today. Students will read two novels and five philosophical theological treatments of the notion of justice in our joint efforts to come to grips with what justice means in our lives: personally and on a national and global scale.

CORE 390-02A: Ethics and Economies of Sustainable Societies

Joseph Desjardins 1-3-5 / 11:20-12:30 / CSB

In this course, we analyze the ethical and economic underpinnings of current industrial societies, critique them, and suggest a different foundation for sustainable societies. The purpose of the course is to decide if societies, such as ours, are sustainable (after we understand the idea) and suggest what a sustainable society could be.

CORE 390-03A: Sex, Spirituality and Values

Felicia Washington 1-3-5 / 1:00-2:10 / CSB

This course will examine the topic of sex, spirituality and one's ability to make good, moral choices about yourself and your life. Various global cultures will be examined to inform our perspectives on the concept of sacred sexuality.

CORE 390-04A: Art and Morality

James Hendershot 2-4-6 / 11:20-12:30 / SJU

Through active involvement, course participants will be developing their own moral framework to deal with the issues addressed by the art world.

CORE 390-05A: Social Issues and the Law

Timothy Robinson 2-4-6 / 1:00-2:10 / SJU

In this course we will practice sorting out the complexities of collective decision-making by focusing on a couple of issues of current interest. Possible topics include capital punishment, abortion, affirmative action, the morality of war and others.

CORE 390-06A: Moral Choices for a Healthy Life

Janet Neuwirth 2-4-6 / 2:40-3:50 / CSB

How do our lifestyle choices affect our physical and mental health? How do they affect the physical and mental health of families and communities? What is a healthy life? This course will focus on the identification and analysis of ethical issues that impact our health as individuals and as communities. Examination of moral dilemmas and ethical principles will be illustrated by their application to specific health choices.

CORE 390-07A: Innocents Abroad, or the Holy Land in the Middle East

Roger Kasprick, OSB Monday / 6:00-9:00 p.m. / SJU

How do persons of several different cultures, nationalities, religions and personal sympathies live together in the same small area? How did the U.S. become so intimately involved for the past 50 years? In looking at the ethical and moral underpinning of Holy Land policies, we will at the same time necessarily probe and analyze the values which guide our own personal choices.

CORE 390-08A: Do Animals Have Rights?

Elizabeth Wurdak Monday and Thursday / 6:30-8:00 p.m. / CSB

In this class we shall examine the case for animal rights through readings, film, discussion, debate, site visits and reaction papers.

CORE 390-09A: Spheres of Justice

James Murphy Tuesday / 6:00-9:00 p.m. / SJU

A consideration of the principles of justice, authority and freedom as they pertain to poverty, education and health care. Consideration of these issues in light of grand policy principles will demonstrate the moral basis of public policy making.

CORE 390-10A: Intellectual Property and Technology

James Schnepf Tuesday / 6:30-9:30 p.m. / SJU

Technological changes strain ethical and legal views of intellectual property in areas such as copyrights and patents. This course will work to develop a framework for viewing intellectual property in light of these technological changes.

CORE 390-11A: Passages and Transitions: Gender Matters?"

Charles Thornbury Tuesday & Thursday / 6:30-8:00 p.m. / SJU

This course examines the moral and ethical implications of our concepts of "manhood" and "womanhood." We will begin with the

earliest rites of passages in pre- and post-adolescence to old age in American culture and pause for a while at ages 18 to 22. We will be especially interested in the moral and ethical assumptions of gender roles after college: in the workplace, in committed relationships (friendships, non-traditional relationships), in marriage, and in families (fatherhood, motherhood, single-parent families, blended families).

This course is cross-listed with GWST 390

CORE 390-12A: Living the Good Life: Ethical Choices In Our Complex World

Vera Theisen Thursday / 6:30-9:30 p.m. / CSB

This course will encourage students to examine their values and the moral choices they must make, from the smallest to the most important. It will include the study of virtues and basic ethical theories as a prelude to the discussion of various human rights and social justice issues in a world that is becoming more complex yet interconnected.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

ENVR 150: Introduction to Environmental Studies

Interdisciplinary introduction to environmental studies. Case-based investigation of environmental issues combining perspectives from the social sciences, natural sciences, and humanities. Topics will vary but may include such subjects as endangered species, air/water pollution, environmental justice/racism, animal rights, global warming, ecotourism, agriculture, nature writing, campus ecology, and others.

The objective of this course is to serve as an introduction to the field of Environmental Studies by familiarizing students with the range of interdisciplinary approaches via a series of case studies. Students will learn to critically assess the impacts of human actions on the environment, to understand the value of interdisciplinary study and will achieve the basic familiarity with current environmental issues needed to continue in the program and to be well-informed citizens. Students will also examine their own lifestyle choices and become aware of their impacts on the local, national, and global environments.

GENDER & WOMEN'S STUDIES

GWST 390: Passages and Transitions: Gender Matters?"

Charles Thornbury

This course is cross-listed with CORE 390-11A. See course description under CORE 390.

HISTORY

HIST 200: Sophomore Colloquium: THE IRISH POTATO FAMINE: GENOCIDE, JUDICIOUS POLICY, OR NATURAL DISASTER?

Dr. Cynthia Curran

This crucial episode in history will be examined from a number of positions including that of the 19th century British government, Irish nationalists, a number of historians, and modern popular opinion. Throughout the semester we will attempt to answer the following question: If the 'facts' are undisputed, then why are the interpretations so varied and controversial?

We will read official and personal accounts of the famine, including conflicting descriptions in contemporary newspapers. We will learn how to judge the value of different sources and discern how historians construct interpretations of the past and why these conclusions often change. Not only will we understand the Irish famine and its historical context, but also we will comprehend the mechanics of 'doing' history.

HIST 389-01A: Historiography & Methods

Ken Jones

This section of HIST 389 is designed for Social Science majors who are Secondary Education minors.

This course has multiple goals. At the most basic level, it is intended to make you more familiar with the history of the United States over the last 50 years, but it also raises the issue of historiography, or how the story of these decades has evolved as different people have shaped the narrative. Finally, it is designed to increase your readiness to teach High School History. My hope is that you will leave this course with more confidence in your ability to lecture and lead discussion, and with some new ideas on how to make the recent past exciting for the students you will soon be teaching.

HIST 389-02A: Historiography & Methods: The Catholic Reformation Elisabeth Wengler

In this course, we will examine historians' interpretations of the Catholic Reformation. We will examine the Catholic Reformation's many manifestations, for example, at the Council of Trent, in the Inquisition, in

the creation of new religious orders, in its impact on ordinary men and women and, through its influence on the arts. Reading may include: John O'Malley, *Trent and All That* and/or *The First Jesuits*; Gillian T. Ahlgren, *Teresa of Avila and the Politics of Sanctity*; Anne Jacobson Schutte, *Aspiring Saints: pretense of holiness, inquisition, and gender in the Republic of Venice, 1618-1750*; Stephen Haliczzer, *Inquisition and society in early modern Europe*. This course is intended for History majors and its purpose is to examine history as an interpretation of the past.

HONORS

HONR 220: Introduction to Human Communication

Jeanne Cook

This course provides students with a general overview of the communication theory and research, particularly as it relates to their everyday interactions. Topics may include theories of communication on meaning, language, perception, nonverbal cues, gender, relationships, self-disclosure, conflict, listening persuasion, groups, organizations, and cultures.

HONR 230: Dance Audience

Leigh Dillard

This course is designed to help students gain an understanding and develop an appreciation of dance as an art form. The course includes a brief survey of dance history with an emphasis on the role of dance in different cultures, especially non-Christian, Asian and African, and on the particular social, political, and religious contexts for dance in those cultures. Different dance styles (e.g., ballet, modern, flamenco, Indian) and choreographic forms are studied through attending live performances, viewing videotapes, research, and experiential movement explorations and composition exercises. Class discussions focus on connecting influences from different cultures and historical forms to contemporary dance and on finding the relevance of dance, both content and form, as a viable and vital art form to the lives of the students.

HONR 240: The Development of the Christian Tradition

Vincent Smiles

An introduction to the discipline of Christian theology with a substantial focus on select themes and texts of the scriptures, such as creation, covenant, kingdom, prophets, gospel and New Testament letters. Attention is also given to the method of theological study and the development of the Christian tradition since Biblical times. Students will be introduced to the Biblical languages, especially Hebrew, and will learn to think critically both about the Bible and about modern theological controversies.

HONR 310: Great Books/Ideas (HMU)

Mark Thamert

This is a year-long discussion based seminar that concentrates on some of the world's greatest works of literature, philosophy, and intellectual history. Authors may include Augustine, Euripides, Austen, Thoreau, Biblical writers, Camus, Dostoevsky, Tolstoy, Eliot, Faulkner, Pynchon, Freud, Homer, Kafka, Melville, Dinesen, Flannery O'Connor, Plato, Nabokov, Shakespeare, Cervantes, Virginia Woolf, and others. Preference will be given to Junior honors students, but Seniors will also be considered. Registration is my permission of the instructor only. Interested students should email the instructor. All students in this course purchase a personal library consisting of roughly 100 books, and students are required to read a number of novels and plays during the summer.

HONR 320: Global Environmental Politics (SSU)

Jeff Anderson

This course explores the efforts of nation-states to collectively deal with global environmental problems, examines alternatives to the nation-state (e.g. environmental NGOs), and studies domestic political movements to protect the environment from indigenous movements to the Green party. Cross-cultural differences regarding the very concept of "the environment" will be observed. The course is historically rooted. We will examine how global environmental action has emerged as a result of increased international cooperation, newly available scientific information, ambivalence about the "success" of "development", and changing attitudes regarding our responsibility to nature. Through the application of such concepts as the "tragedy of the commons", collective action theory, and regime formation we will attempt to devise public policy solutions to challenging environmental issues.

HONR 340: Ethics and the Jewish Tradition (JC)

An introduction to the sources of Jewish moral principles (as presented in the narrative and legal portions of the Bible and rabbinic literature) and the relationship of those principles to other Jewish religious concepts.

Students will then explore how the classical sources can be used in

practical moral problems, including medical decisions, social and business dilemmas, and interpersonal relationships. The course will conclude by examining the unique ethical challenges posed by the events of the Holocaust.

MANAGEMENT

MGMT 305-01A: Marketing on the Internet

Richard Saucier

The objective of this course is to increase students' understanding of the many complex issues related to marketed goods and services on the Internet. Focus is on the development and analysis of web-based communication strategies for domestic and global entities.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 321

MGMT 305-02A: Corporate Financial Analysis

Jamie Partridge

This course is a mixture of financial theory along with real world applications. The course builds on the concepts of MGMT-331. Students will work in groups analyzing problems faced by actual companies. All analysts will be done using Excel spreadsheets. Topics covered will include financial forecasting, capital budgeting, the cost of capital, capital structure, and long-term financing.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 331

MGMT 305-03A: Management Information Systems

Michael Miller

Conceptual foundations of MIS, roles of computer-based information systems in organizations, global and ethical issues in MIS, and business application software with an emphasis on database management systems.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 241

MGMT 305-04A: Managing Without Profits: The World of Non-Profit Organizations

John Hasselberg

According to W. Edwards Deming, non-profit organizations are one of the three pillars of society, along with for-profits and governments. They are major bearers of culture in a time when culture itself has become a commodity in an era of globalization. Non-profit organizations include colleges and universities, hospitals and insurance companies, churches and temples and synagogues, social and political action groups, theaters and art museums and orchestras--- without which our world would be a much less interesting and inspiring place to live. This course will examine the roles non-profits play in local and global societies and communities as well as the strategic and operational opportunities and challenges managers face when working without the pressures or the possibilities present in for-profit organizations. Passion and purpose, volunteerism and commitment, fund-raising and cost constraints, community involvement and group identity, service and human development, private and public support, education and careers, and cultures and icons as commodities and some of the topics which will be covered.

PREREQUISITE: SWRK 201, ECON 301, ACCT 331

MGMT 380: Applied Strategic Management

Fulfills the experiential learning requirement for management majors. This course is designed as a management practicum to reinforce the link between strategic theories and application of the theories. Students enrolled in this practicum will meet periodically in a classroom setting to share their common experiences. Students will set up their own practicums early in the semester and will write a summary paper on their practicums as a final project. Students can choose from a menu of practicums including: volunteer service learning commitments, campus organizational leadership positions, and community work with managerial responsibilities.

PREREQUISITE: Senior Management Major

MGMT 397: Internship

Practical off-campus experience with a solid academic component. Previous course work in management is necessary. Information is available in the management department. Completed application of internship form is required. Interns are required to attend several seminars throughout the semester as a group with all of the other management interns. Students will be assigned common readings and will be required to write a final paper that connects theory, reflection and practice.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 114-01A & 02A: Math Exploration

Jennifer Galovich

The focus of these sections will be on Knots and Surfaces. When is a knot not a knot? Is the earth round? (And how do you know?) Can you color me a map of the continental U.S. using only four crayons? Three? And, most important, why should anyone care? We will explore the answers to these and other equally fascinating questions, as well as how they are applied in the "real" world. Classroom emphasis will be on guided discovery, and each student will present a final project

MATH 340: Mathematical Modeling

This course serves as an introduction to the formulation, analysis and interpretation of mathematical models in the study of problems in the natural, management, and social sciences. Some of the topics include optimization, dimensional analysis, Markov chains and autonomous systems.

MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES

SPAN 150: Intensive Beginner's Spanish

Elizabeth Guzman

Spanish 150 is an intensive Spanish course whose task oriented approach aims at helping students develop fluency in understanding, speaking, reading, and writing in Spanish. It also intends to prepare students for a deeper understanding of the civilization and culture of the Spanish-speaking world. Due to its demanding nature, this course incorporates CAI (Computer Assisted Instruction) and other technological resources ON A REGULAR BASIS to facilitate students' language acquisition. This course is restricted to students who have had a minimum of one year of foreign language learning experience (preferably with Romance languages such as Spanish, French or Italian) or can be taken by permission of the instructor.

Spanish 150 covers the thematic and linguistic content of Span 111 and 112 in one semester, carries a load of **eight (8)** credit hours, meets 70 minutes per day, and is taught on days 1 through 6. It is the equivalent of taking two courses.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENT: A minimum of one year of a **recent** (no longer than a year from the time of entrance to course) foreign language learning experience or permission of the instructor.

SKILLS EMPHASIZED: This course focuses on the development of the following language skills: speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Emphasis will be placed on the development of communicative skills in which accuracy plays an important role. The study of grammar will be approached from a functional perspective.

EVALUATION:

- A minimum of two (3) written exams, (maximum 4)
- Two (3) in-class compositions,
- Two (2) speaking examinations: a mid-term and a final
- A minimum of Three/Four (6) reading quizzes
- Compulsory Audio-visual component activities outside of class: students will devote one seventy-minute class per week to computer-assisted instruction at one of the computer labs on campus.

MUSIC

MUSC 233: Orchestra

Performance of a range of orchestral music from symphonic to chamber. Repertoire to be chosen from the standard orchestral literature. **Audition required.** The objective of the course is to give an orchestral performance in a college setting.

MUSC 272: Song Writer's Workshop

This course focuses on the composing of songs and lyrics in the pop music genre. George Maurer, nationally known composer, performer and founder of Pine Curtain Records, will work with students in the writing of melodies, harmonies and lyrics. Other experts in lyrics and arranging will work with the class. There may be the possibility to record compositions.

Prerequisites: some previous experience in song writings, and permission of George Maurer.

PEACE STUDIES

PCST 345: Language and the Literature of Conflict

Rene McGraw

Using 19th - 21st century fiction and poetry, this course will look at issues of conflict and draw from the reading an understanding of the world opened up by the text. How does the vision of the world drawn from text and language touch the way people respond in conflict? How does the philosophy of language as it has been understood by contemporary continental philosophy affect the understanding of conflict?

This course is cross-listed with PHIL 345

PCST 368-01A: Intergroup Conflict and Conflict Management

Ronald Pagnucco

Ethic, radical, political, religious and other forms of intergroup conflict plague the world today. Everyone from scholars to politicians to concerned citizens are struggling to understand these types of conflict and what might be done to prevent or manage them. In this course we will look at social psychological, anthropological, sociological, political science and environmental theories of intergroup conflict and its management. We will look at case studies in the U.S. and abroad. We will also use role-plays to help us understand these conflicts. We will also investigate strategies of conflict, including nonviolence, and methods of conflict intervention and resolution. The course is intended to provide an informed understanding of intergroup conflicts in the world today, and what might be done about them.

PCST 368-02A: Women and Peace

Kelly Kraemer

This course will explore the connections between gender and peace in theory and in practice, with a special focus on the traditions of women's peace and activism. Topics to be examined include theories relating gendered notions of human nature to violence and peace, militarism (and other forms of institutionalized violence) to violence against women, motherhood of peace, and feminism to nonviolence; the reasons for women-only and women-centered peace groups and movements; the history of women's peace movements in the U.S. and around the world; and the links between women's peace movements, women's rights movements, and other movements for social justice.

PCST 368-71A: Topic: Holocaust

Daniel McKanan

This course is cross-listed with CORE 369-01A

This course will employ multiple perspectives-scholarly historical texts, survival narratives (written and on videotape), philosophical and theological pondering, and literary works-in-order to cast light on two basic questions: 1) What were the basic roles of the Nazi perpetrators and the Jewish and other victims? And 2) What does the Holocaust mean in terms of the decisions that face us in the contemporary world?

PHILOSOPHY

PHIL 345: Language and the Literature of Conflict

Rene McGraw

This course is cross-listed with PCST 345

PHIL 368: Special Topics: Morality & Human Nature

Philosophers have wondered about the basis of human morality since the beginning of recorded history. Some have argued that human morality is innate, a kind of "moral instinct," while others have insisted that it is learned. Some have insisted that morality is a matter of feeling a certain way; others insist that it is a matter of thinking a certain way. Disagreements continue to this day. With all these arguments to and fro, the bewildered inquirer is likely to wonder whether there is any evidence that might help to settle the question. Enter the (relatively) new and recently reenergized tradition of evolutionary ethics. Advocates of this approach to ethics suggest that human morality is in some sense the product of natural selection. Humans with a certain propensity for fair play, the argument goes, are more likely to survive and reproduce than those lacking this propensity. As a result, at least some aspects of human morality would seem to be innate, products of the evolutionary history of the human species. But which aspects? Will this approach settle the question of whether morality is a matter of feeling or reason? And if morality really is in some sense innate, how is it that humans can behave so badly so much of the time? Can this scientifically informed approach really help to settle these age-old philosophical debates? Let's find out. This class will examine recent writings by philosophers and scientists discussing the proposition that human morality is the result of natural selection.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYC 393-01A: Psychology and the Environment:

Richard Wielkiewicz

Oskamp (2000) writing in the flagship journal, *American Psychologist*, stated “[u]rgent changes to human lifestyles and cultural practices are required for the world to avoid ecological disaster, and psychologists should lead the way in helping people adopt sustainable patterns of living” (p. 496). The purpose of this senior seminar is to examine psychology’s role in leading society toward a more sustainable existence. Applying a psychological perspective to environmental issues will enable course participants to take an integrative look at many aspects of human psychology including ethics, learning, the role of the media, development, social, abnormal, organizations, and health. The course will also provide an opportunity to display the critical thinking and writing skills developed during your liberal arts education here.

PSYC 393-02A: College Student Development

Rodger Narloch

This course will focus on reviewing the psychological literature describing the development that college students experience in a variety of areas (e.g., cognitive, identity, spirituality, alcohol use, etc.) and comparing the resulting knowledge to the developments that occur among CSB/SJU students. The course will be structured around each pair of students co-authoring a chapter (approx. 25-35 pages) in an edited book that the class will create. Students will also be required to critique the writing of their peers as well as incorporate peer and instructor feedback into multiple drafts of their chapter.

SOCIOLOGY

SOCI 337: Inequalities

Jeff Kamakahi

What processes influence whether social differences will result in social inequalities? To what extent does inequality exist within social groups and societies? How is inequality measured? What role does culture play in the persistence of intergenerational patterns of inequality? How does one’s position within the stratification system affect one’s life course? This course will attempt to address these and other questions under the conceptual rubric of social stratification.

SOCIAL WORK

SWRK 330: Administration

John Yoakam

“[Administration] Examines a variety of topics related to social welfare administration, including administrative styles, fund raising, proposal writing, bureaucracies, inter-organizational coordination and supervision.” The course could be beneficial to management majors who are looking into the nonprofit and government sectors. It would have a different slant from courses offered in your department, which might provide some diversity for your students.

PREREQUISITE: SWRK 201, ECON 301, ACCY 331

SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

HHTH 468: History of Women in American Religion (WEB course)

Mary Bednarowski

One On CAMPUS meeting-TBA

Although women have outnumbered men in church membership since the end of the seventeenth century, there is relative absence of their names in the historical record. What can history tell us about both this absence and the contributions of women to American religion? Why is it that typically when women appear in religious histories, they almost always are classified as dissenters? Is it the case, as colonial historian Laurel Thatcher Ulrich has suggested that, “nice women don’t make history”? The course explores some of the theological ideas that have fostered women’s leadership in American religious history and some of the women who have survived the filtering process of history. It also examines the theological vision of contemporary women from many different religious traditions who speak as women about their deepest religious convictions.

MONS 468: Reading the Bible with Benedict (WEB course)

Irene Nowell, OSB

NO CAMPUS

Using *lectio divina* as the core method, this course explores key scriptural themes that emerge in the Rule of St. Benedict. Particular attention is given to how Scripture influences instructions on humility, obedience, silence, and the community of goods.

PTHM 468-01A: Pastoral Boundaries & Professional Ministry (WEB)

Nils Friberg

NO CAMPUS

Designed for all those exercising leadership in faith communities at local, diocesan, or jurisdictional levels, this course focuses on issues of boundaries and relational integrity for people in ministry. Because the instructor brings particular expertise in addressing the impact on individuals and congregations when boundaries are violated - especially in situations of sexual abuse, participants in the course examine theological and ethical standards that define and shape appropriate behavioral expectations. They also consider the structure of accountability that reduces systemic vulnerability to abusive behavior. This includes attending to one’s own vulnerabilities, those of the systems in which they work, and those of the people with whom they work. With this information participants learn how to prevent misconduct by maintaining appropriate boundaries and establishing respectful relationships with everyone with whom they work. As a result of the course, participants understand the ways faith communities create written policies and procedures around complaint processes, investigations of complaints, responses modes, and advocacy, and how these policies and procedures establish safety and due process for all.

PTHM 468-02A: Issues in Ministry

This course is designed by the sabbatical student and an advisor and focuses on interests the student would like to explore during his/her sabbatical time at St. John’s. A general topic needs to be identified as part of the application process and a written or oral summary provided the Director of Lifelong Learning at the end of the sabbatical. Pass/Fail.

SPIR 468: Islamic Tradition and Spirituality (WEB course)

Noreen Herzfeld

ON CAMPUS dates: September 13-15; December 6-8

Islam is the most rapidly growing faith in the world, not just in the middle and far east, but also here in America. It is a tradition that many of us find both foreign and frightening after the events of last September. What are the basic tenets of the Islamic faith? What are its origins? How are these tenets lived out by ordinary Muslims in a multiplicity of cultures and political regimes in the modern world? In this course we will explore the basic texts and traditions of Islam, with an emphasis on spirituality, i.e. how Muslims experience God’s presence and how this experience leads them to structure their lives.

CORE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide students with a foundation and the intellectual tools necessary to examine the fundamental, recurring questions about ourselves and our world. These questions challenge students to broaden their interests and explore a variety of academic areas. Striving to ask those questions well and make good moral and ethical judgments about them is at the heart of our colleges' mission.

The Core Curriculum is composed of four levels of requirements:

1. Proficiency-based requirements

Foreign language proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in speaking or reading a classical or modern language through satisfactory completion of the language proficiency exam or through satisfactory completion of Modern/Classical Language 211 (with any passing grade).

Mathematics Proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in elementary algebra and geometry through satisfactory completion of the mathematics proficiency exam or calculus readiness exam.

First Year Students beginning Fall 2001 must complete the Fine Arts Experience requirement by attending 10 designated Fine Arts Experience Events—five events per semester.

2. Cross-Disciplinary courses

First-Year Symposium (2 courses)-- CORE 100 & 101, or HONR 100 & 101

Senior Seminar--CORE 390, GWST 390 or HONR 390 only. Education majors can complete EDUC 390 and SWRK majors can complete SWRK 390. Ordinarily completed during Senior year. Cannot be repeated for credit. Both semesters of First-Year Symposium must already be completed.

3. Disciplinary courses

Only courses which are designated within the course title by the appropriate symbol (FA, HML, MT, JC, etc) may be used to complete the following disciplinary requirements.

- FA (4 credits) Must be from courses that are designated as fulfilling Fine Arts
- HML (2 courses) Must be from different departments or disciplines (ex. Not two literature courses even if they are from different department)
- TH (1 course) Must be 100 level theology course.
- HMU (1 course) Must be from the same discipline as one HML or TH already completed.
- JC (1 course) May be satisfied only after the TH and both HML courses are completed.
- MT (1 course) Must have satisfied the Math Proficiency before the completion of the course.
- NS (2 courses) Must be from different departments (unless NATS, COLG, HONR, PCST or ENVR).
- SSL (1 course) Must be 100 level.
- SSU (1 course) Must have completed the SSL course first.

4. Flagged courses

Courses may carry 1 or more flags, in addition to meeting Core disciplinary or Major requirements.

Flagged courses are specific to the instructor and term. Flagged courses are listed in the Class Schedule and updated lists are posted at the Office of the Registrar.

Writing Flag (2 courses) Must have completed both semesters of First-Year Symposium.

Discussion Flag (1 course) Must have completed both semesters of First-Year Symposium.

Gender Perspectives (1 course)

Global Perspectives (1 course)

Quantitative Reasoning (1 course) Must have satisfied Math Proficiency before completing the course.
