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Registration Instructions

FALL 2003

All currently registered students who expect to return to CSB/SJU this Fall must complete advance registration by April 11th. Please follow these instructions carefully, for proper registration is your responsibility. If you have any questions about registration, call the Registrar's Office at 5260 (CSB) or 3396 (SJU).

STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER ONLY IF THEY HAVE:

- Met with their advisor to obtain their Label with Registration PIN #
- Settled all current charges with the Student Accounts Office
- Been accepted by a department (unless they are a first-year student)
- Complied with Minnesota immunization regulations
- Have an active Network account

We strongly urge you to meet with your advisor early and enter your registration on WEBSTER on the date listed on your PIN Label. **Registration is on-line, and delaying your registration will affect course selection.**

Students who are ineligible to register for any of these reasons may register on WEBSTER after they have cleared all registration holds.

Please note that registration for ILPs (Individualized Learning Projects) and for special programs (Tri-College Exchange, Internships, etc.) requires your submission of special forms available from the Registrar's Office. Registration for Internships (8 credits or more) are due the first day of classes.

REGISTRATION ADJUSTMENTS

Registration adjustments (Drop/Add) can be done on WEBSTER through Sept. 2nd. **You will need your Registration PIN# that you received from your Advisor.** After this date, to drop a course, students can come to the Registrar's Office at SJU, Quad 161 or at CSB, Academic Services Building, 208.

Listings of canceled or closed courses will be electronically updated on the Class Schedule Information on WEBSTER. Students should use WEBSTER to check whether a space has become available in a course that was previously closed. Courses may be added through the first 4 class days of the semester.

If a course is closed, check whether there are any other sections of the same course that have spaces available in them and register for an alternate section. If this option is not available to you, consider alternate courses and select among these and register accordingly. Your advisor is a good resource to help determine an appropriate alternate. In some cases, it may be appropriate for the department chair or instructor to "override" a student beyond the course limit. Override registrations are completed by the student presenting a signed (department chair or instructor, as appropriate) Drop/Add card to the Registrar's Office.

We also ask that you use the "Request for Additional Course Spaces" menu item on WEBSTER registration to report a course that you wished to take but were unable to enroll in any section of. Your reporting this will help the colleges plan for possible limit changes or additional sections of the course-both for this semester and for future semesters. Please do not report a course if you were able to register for an alternate section of the same course. This request DOES NOT place you on a waiting list for the course.

REGISTRATION PRIORITY AND COURSE SELECTION

Registration priority is based first on class standing, then on the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Seniors are assigned courses first, then juniors, sophomores and first-year students. For Fall Semester registration, the lowest (0000) four digits have the highest priority. You are encouraged to keep these priorities in mind when you develop your course requests. **WEBSTER will immediately respond to your course selection by indicating Enrolled or Closed.**

Instructions for Using WEBSTER

AT ANY NETWORKED PC:

Log on to the PC (your username and password)
Click on the START button
Select NETWORK PROGRAMS
Select INTERNET BROWSERS
Click on INTERNET EXPLORER
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>
The CSB/SJU HOMEPAGE displays

FROM OTHER PC'S THAT HAVE ACCESS TO A WEB BROWSER:

Sign on as you normally would, then
Enter <http://www.csbsju.edu/>
The CSB/SJU HOMEPAGE displays

- Click on **"Inside CSB/SJU"**. Then click on the word **"Student Links"** and click on **"WEBSTER"** on the left hand side under **"ACADEMIC"**
- Click on the **Fall term ONLINE Registration** icon
- **At the Registration Login Screen**, Click on the box and **Enter your Student ID # (with no spaces or dashes) & Enter your PIN #** in the space labeled "PIN" (**PIN # is on the PIN Label you received from your advisor - Do not use your WSC**)
Click on the **Login** button **once**
- **At the Registration Login Verification Screen**
Click on the box and **Enter your PIN# again** & then click on the **Login** button **once**
- Click on **Fall Term Registration** – from the Main Registration Menu
Click on **Fall 2003** and then click on the **Select Term** button
- **To Enter your Fall Term Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Enter the 5 digit Call #'s for all of the courses you want to register for - call numbers are listed next to the course number in the Spring Class Schedule Booklet. Click on **Submit Registration** button - **you must click on this for your registration to be entered into the computer system.** If there is space in the courses you selected and if you meet the necessary prerequisites, the screen will display **"Registered Successfully"**. It will also display the Course ID, Credits and Title of the courses that you have registered for. If a class is closed or you do not meet the prerequisite the screen will display **"Class Registration failed with error"** and a reason for the error.
- **To change the credits on a Variable Credit Course:**
Click on **Change Course Credit**
Enter the number of credits in the box (select from the range displayed) & click on **Submit Changes**
- **To check course availability:**
Click on **Look-up Class to Add**
Click on the name of the **Subject** and Click on **Select Subject** button
Click on the **Department and Course Number** and Click on **Select Course** button
This will display all the sections of that course, and under 'status' it will state 'open' or 'closed'
(Note: You may **not** be able to register for some courses that are 'open' because you do not meet the prerequisite or quota restrictions for that course.)
- **To request a course that you were unable to enroll in any section of:**
Click on **Request for Additional Course Spaces** - from Student Registration Menu
Enter the **5 digit Call #'s of the course(s) you were not able to enroll in** (this request DOES NOT place you on a wait list for the course).
Click on **Submit**
The screen will display "Courses Requested" or "Course Request Failed" and a reason
- **To change your Fall Registration:**
Click on **ADD/DROP Courses**
Click on the **down arrow in the Action Box** of the course you want to Drop
Click on **DROP**
Under **ADD Class** fill in the **Call #** of the new course you want to Add
Click on **Submit Registration Button** - **this will drop your course and add a new one at the same time. Keep your Registration PIN # - you may Drop/Add for Fall semester until September 2nd.**
- **To send a copy of your Course Requests to the printer:**
Click on File from Menu Bar
Select Print & Click on OK
- **To sign off:**
Click on **Exit WEBSTER**
Exit the CSB/SJU Homepage
Exit Internet Explorer
Log-off the PC

If you took a course at another college which is a required prerequisite of a CSB/SJU course, you MUST contact the Registrar's Office to be registered

PLEASE NOTE:

If you have trouble operating the computer terminal when attempting to enter your Fall Term registration, please **(1) ask for assistance from the Computer access student employee, or (2) contact the Office of the Registrar.** The students who staff the Access Areas have been trained on the use of WEBSTER and are ready to respond to questions you may have while entering your registration.

DROP/ADD on WEBSTER

If you would like to drop and add courses for Fall Term 2003 you may do this through WEBSTER until September 2nd. Please keep your Registration PIN #, you will need this to Drop/Add on WEBSTER. After this date you will need to drop and add courses in the Registrar's Office.

OBTAINING A NETWORK ACCOUNT

All students must have a NETWORK account to use WEBSTER from the Network PC's on campus. Most of you will already have an account, which you may use for many other functions besides course registration. If you do not have a Network account--or have forgotten your password or how to sign on--please follow these simple steps to obtain your Network account:

- Step #1:** Go the Computing Center at SJU, Quad 084, from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm
- Step #2:** Identify yourself as needing a Network account.
- Step #3:** Activate your account on one of the PC's in the computing center

PROBLEMS -- Discussed below are some common problems we expect some of you may encounter, and how you may solve them.

- **Your PIN # doesn't work.**
Solution: Re-check your label and carefully re-enter the PIN #. You may have to Exit WEBSTER completely and logon again. **YOUR PIN# for registration is not the same as your WSC (Webster Security Code) that you use to access Student Information on WEBSTER**
 Please note: the PIN # is not displayed (for security reasons) as you enter it on the computer.
- **You lost your PIN #.**
Solution: Contact your Advisor to get your Pin Number again, or bring your Advisor's signature to the Registrar's Office. (PIN #'s cannot be obtained in the Computer Access Areas)
- **You entered the wrong Call #.**
Solution: WEBSTER allows you to make changes to your registration. See the section on changing your fall registration in the "Instructions for using WEBSTER". You may make changes on WEBSTER through September 2nd.
- **While using WEBSTER it displays: "This session for your Login has expired".**
Solution: WEBSTER is programmed to Log off of the Registration Screen if you **leave the screen idle for more than 2 minutes**. If this should this happen, simply sign on again. To do so, click on WEBSTER and then click on the Fall Registration icon and start over.
- **WEBSTER shows the status of a course as 'open' but it will not permit you to register for the course.**
Solution: You may not meet the prerequisites or quota restrictions for that course. Check the notes in the class schedule under that course or contact the Registrar's Office.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

ACADEMIC ADVISING

After receiving this Class Schedule booklet, visit your academic advisor to arrange a program of classes for next term, and have him or her place your PIN label on the Class Request Worksheet located on the back page of your Fall 2003 Class Schedule Booklet.

If you intend to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. Overloads may be attempted only by students in good academic standing, and overloads of 20 or more credits require the student to see the Academic Advising Office.

AUDITING

Students intending to audit a course (earn no credit) should indicate their intent when registering for the course, or complete a Drop/Add card and file it with the Registrar's Office during the first week of class. Auditors are expected to attend all regular classes, but they are not required to take final exams. A student who first registers for credit may change to auditor status any time during the first month of class. A student who first enrolls for auditor status may change to credit status only during the first week of class. Courses audited are not included in determining the total credits earned; however, the credit value of any course audited is computed in the assessment of tuition.

ADDING A CLASS

Tuesday, September 2nd is the last day you may ADD a full-term course to your program, unless the course's first meeting is scheduled after September 2nd. No student may enroll for a full-term course after the second scheduled meeting without the instructor's consent.

DROPPING A CLASS

- **Sept. 2nd** Last day to Add a full term course to your schedule
- **Sept. 22nd** Last day to receive a permanent drop on your schedule
- **Nov. 17th** Last day to receive a "W" on your transcript. If you withdraw after this date, your instructor will assign you an "F" at the end of the semester.

For courses scheduled for less than a full term, withdrawal during the first third of the course will result in no record entry; during the second third, a W entry; during the final third, a failure.

EXEMPTION/SUBSTITUTION

In exceptional circumstances students may petition for exemption/substitution from specific academic regulations. Forms for requesting an exemption/substitution are available from the Registrar's Office. Students should first consult with their academic advisor, whose signature on the exemption/substitution form represents a recommendation that the request be considered favorably by the approving official. Department chairs are the approving officials for exemptions/substitutions from requirements within majors and minors. Exemptions/substitutions from academic regulations beyond major and minor fields require the approval of the academic dean of the student's college. Requests for these non-departmental exemptions/substitutions should be directed to the Academic Advising Offices. The guiding principle in considering requests for any exemption/substitution is fidelity to the academic standards of the colleges.

INDIVIDUAL LEARNING PROJECTS

The guidelines and application forms for Individual Learning Projects, sometimes called Independent Study, are available in the Registrar's Office. If you are planning an ILP for Fall term, please consult these guidelines. Remember, only 4 credits of ILP per term are allowed. You may indicate your intent to register for an ILP by requesting DNA 271 01A **Call #10359**, or DNA 371-01A, **Call #10360** on WEBSTER. First-year students are not eligible for ILPs.

POLICY ON INCOMPLETE GRADE

The policy concerning the temporary grade Incomplete (I) includes the following points:

When circumstances warrant, instructors may allow some delay in the completion of course work. Such extensions shall not extend beyond the close of the following regular (fall or spring) semester, and earlier limits may be set at the discretion of the instructor.

The instructor must report on the official grade roster the grade "I" followed by the approximate grade the student will receive if the course work is not complete by the end of the following semester (e.g., IF, or IC, or IB). That grade will be used in the computation of grade point averages until the Incomplete is removed.

If by the end of the following semester the instructor reports a single final grade to the Registrar, that grade will replace the I/GRADE, the Incomplete will be removed, and averages recomputed accordingly. Otherwise the provisional grade that was assigned with the "I" will become a permanent part of the transcript.

Exceptions to the above may be granted only by the written permission of the appropriate Academic Dean. Such exceptions will ordinarily be granted only in cases of medical disability or problems of comparable seriousness.

Degree candidates are cautioned that failure to have all degree requirements satisfied (including removal of Incomplete grades in courses needed for graduation) by the reasonable dates set by the Registrar will necessarily result in postponement of their graduation.

INTERNSHIPS

All CSB/SJU students who plan to do an Internship for 8 or more credits during the Summer or Spring of 2004 must enroll in the Pre-Internship

Seminar. The September Pre-Internship Seminar--open to juniors and seniors only--meets during A mod, 8:00 am at SJU, or 2:40 pm at CSB. The Pre-Internship Seminar is for no credit. If you wish to sign up for the seminar or if you have questions about other options, contact the Internship Office, Academic Services Building, phone 5799. **ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND TWO ADDITIONAL SESSIONS: 1) LEGAL ISSUES OF INTERNSHIPS and 2) REGISTRATION AND REQUIREMENTS.** CHECK WITH THE INTERNSHIP OFFICE FOR EXACT DATES. The last day to register for a Fall Internship is September 2nd. You may indicate your intent to register for an Internship by requesting DNA 397-01A, **Call #10361** through WEBSTER.

SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

All internships which take place during the summer must be registered under the Summer term rather than under either the preceding Spring semester or the following Fall semester. This policy will be strictly enforced for the 2003 Summer.

The last day to register for a Summer Internship is Friday, May 9th. Registration after this date requires approval of the Academic Dean. You must have taken the Pre-internship seminar. If you have not done so contact Julie Christle, phone 5799 for information on alternative meetings.

Please contact Jill Farry, Director of Internships (Academic Services Center, Phone 5799), for information regarding special tuition structures for Summer Internships.

MODULAR SCHEDULING

Some departments offer courses of less than a full term's length; these courses begin and end according to the following dates and are called Modules, or "Mods". Each Mod is nine regular teaching periods and will be listed by the codes below in the Official Class Schedule:

Advisors will have access to their advisees' On Track advising aid through WEB for Faculty or the BARRY Advising System. Remember, all students **MUST** see their advisor to receive their WEBSTER Registration PIN # Label.

If you plan to register for more than 18 credits, you are incurring an overload. The overload tuition fee is estimated at \$565.00 per credit over 18. Students whose cumulative grade point average is below 2.00 may not register for an overload. Students in good academic standing (GPA above 2.00) may register for a maximum of 1 overload credit (19 credits overall) without permission. Credit totals of 20 or more require the student to see the Academic Advising Office. The WEBSTER registration system will not allow you to register for more than 19 credits.

REPEATING A COURSE

A course that has been failed may be repeated for credit. Courses that have been passed may not be repeated for credit. They may, however, be repeated for additional honor points. The original grade is not removed when the course is repeated and credit for a course can be earned only once. The higher grade is computed in the GPA. If you are registering for a course that you are repeating you **MUST** notify the Registrar's Office.

STUDENT TEACHING

Students registering for student teaching (EDUC 361, 362, 363) in their 9th (or greater) semester as a full-time student at CSB/SJU will be billed at ½ the regular tuition rate for that semester. These students will also not be charged the student activity fee, technology fee, and campus center fee for that semester. Institutional gift aid (scholarships/grants) will not be available to these students.

STUDY ABROAD

CSB and SJU offer a number of group overseas study programs. Students who plan to enroll in one of these programs should contact the International Studies Office, QUAD 128 at SJU. Students who are considering enrolling in coursework offered abroad by another institution (Consortium/External Study Abroad) should contact the International Education Office or the Registrar's Office, for information on transfer of credits. Students who register for SA 372, Consortium/External Study Abroad, will be billed a \$175 fee.

S/U REGISTRATION

Arrangements for this non-honor point grading option should be made with your professor at the beginning of the course. Remember that undergraduates are limited in the number and types of courses they may take for the grade S (Satisfactory). See the Catalog for specific rules. First-year students may not take the S/U option except for a course with only S/U grades available. The grade S, once turned in by the instructor, is **NOT SUBJECT TO LATER CHANGE**.

Grading options are listed in the Class Schedule as either GRADING OPTION A-F REQUIRED or GRADING OPTION S-U REQUIRED. If neither of these is listed, the instructor will permit eligible students to choose either option by the date the instructor specifies at the beginning of the course. Once you have chosen, you may not request that the S/U be changed to an honor point grade.

If coursework grades average below a C under the S/U option, the grade U (Unsatisfactory) will be given with no credit earned.

TRI-COLLEGE EXCHANGE

The College of Saint Benedict, Saint John's University, and Saint Cloud State University have an agreement that encourages regular full-time undergraduate students to take courses on any of the three campuses. Registration is limited to fall and spring semesters. If you are interested in taking courses at Saint Cloud State, you can pick up a copy of their Class Schedule and a registration application at the Registrar's Office. If a course seems suitable for your program of studies, see your advisor for permission to register. To register, file the approved application with the Registrar's Office at the St. John's campus before August 21st. The course will be added to your Fall 2003 Student Detail Schedule, if space is available.

CSB/SJU students will be billed tuition, and other fees, at CSB/SJU rates. If a student is not registered for more than 18 total credits, there will ordinarily be no additional charge. For credits over 18, an additional tuition charge of \$565.00 (estimate), will be made for each additional semester credit hour.

If you have any questions about Tri-College Exchange and the suitability of SCSU courses toward your degree program, see Jane Simon in the Registrar's Office, QUAD 161.

TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

Current students may request an unofficial copy of their transcript at no charge from the Registrar's Office. Official transcript requests must be submitted in writing to the Registrar's Office and may be picked up at the Registrar's Office (or we can mail them for you) 2-3 working days after the request is made, except during the first and last week of each term.

Former students may request a transcript copy for \$3.00 per transcript. The fee for faxing a transcript will be \$3.00 per transcript. If the transcript is faxed outside the U.S. the fee will be a minimum of \$5.00. All transcript requests must be submitted in writing via mail or fax and payment must accompany the order.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COLLEGE

Complete withdrawal from all of your courses during the term must be initiated with your Residential Director at CSB, Mary Commons 221 or

the Residential Life Office, Sexton 127 at SJU. If you withdraw by September 22nd no official record of your registration for that term will be made. If you withdraw between September 23rd and November 17th, the mark "W" will appear behind that term's courses on your transcript. If you withdraw after November 17th, all courses for that term will be followed by the grade of "F". If you decide to withdraw after the term ends, you **MUST** notify the office mentioned above.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL MINNESOTA STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE MINNESOTA GRANT PROGRAM:

You must register for a minimum of 15 credits each semester to receive a Minnesota Grant at the full-time student rate. Students who register for 12-14 credits may still receive a Minnesota Grant but the award amount will be substantially reduced. Please direct any questions to the Financial Aid Office at CSB or SJU. (For all other aid programs, 12 credits is still considered full-time.)

Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for their final exam

The academic calendar concludes each semester with a one-day study and four-day test cycle. Faculty may administer final exams for their classes only during the exam periods officially scheduled by the Registrar's Office. Cumulative final examinations may not be given during the regularly scheduled class days of the semester. If there is to be a cumulative final exam in a course, all exams given during the semester must be returned for student review by the last scheduled day of class.

Instructors of each full-term course are expected to announce at the beginning of the course whether a written two-hour final examination will be given. Such an exam will be administered during the four-day test cycle according to the schedule above. Note that a class is assigned a test time and day in the schedule according to the cycle and time period it meets during the semester. Classes that meet after Period V may use their last regularly scheduled class period for a final exam.

One period has been reserved on each of the four test days for the administration of a common exam for multiple-section courses who so desire. A list of such courses, and their exam times, will be announced this fall. The legend, MS, in the accompanying chart signifies times set aside for these multi-section common exams.

FALL 2003 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ART

ART 208: Survey of Non-Western Art

Selected survey of great architecture, sculpture and painting of Asia and other non-Western cultures. A study of artworks in relation to religion, culture, philosophy and geography of the non-Western World.

ART 209: European Survey

An introductory survey of the most significant periods in European Art History from the Ancient World to the present. A study of artworks in relation to religion, culture, philosophy and geography of the European Cultures.

ART 262: Digital Video I

A practical and theoretical introduction to digital video as an art form and a means of communication. Production includes writing, shooting, lighting and sound recording, while post-production involves editing image and sound on the Macintosh computer, and distribution in formats of tape, DVD, video installation and the Internet.

ART 233: Arts Appreciation

During this course students will be actively involved (hands-on) in individual and group work. The work that students will be doing will involve relief prints, colligraph (a type of printing), and mono-prints. Group work will involve presentations and research. Through observation the students will define the elements and principles of design as this relates to existing works of art as well as self-created works of art. Various media, including photocopy, will be explored throughout the course.

COMMUNICATION

COMM 383: Media Effects

Erin Szabo

This course will examine the use and effects of mass media for individuals and societies, and will attempt to answer such questions as: Who is affected by the mass media, What effects occur, How do these effects occur, To what degree, What type of media content is responsible for various effects, and What particular contexts and individual differences make media effects more or less likely? This class will primarily focus on adults and the effects of television, newspapers, magazines and film, because these are the most heavily researched areas. Nonetheless, much of the research will apply to radio, books and the Internet, as well. Finally, this class will employ a social scientific approach to exploring the question of media effects, with representative research being read and discussed. The objectives of the course are: (1) to provide you with an understanding of the theories and research that inform our knowledge of the effects of mass media; (2) to acquire the ability to apply mass media theories to current events; (3) to enhance logical thinking, critical reasoning, and use of social scientific evidence to support conclusions about the effects of mass media; (4) to become a more critical, educated media consumer. Students will be evaluated on mastery of these objectives in lecture, writing, group work, small group discussion, and on examinations.

NOTE: Students who have already completed COMM 349, Media Criticism with Erin Szabo may not enroll in this course.

COURSES OF THE COLLEGE

COLG 130: EMT Basics

This course covers basic minimal emergency care required to work on an ambulance or first responder squad throughout the 50 states in the U.S. The course offers basic to more advanced techniques and principles of pre-hospital; emergency care. Students must be at least eighteen years old to take the National and State Certification exams. Students who have been convicted of a felony should contact the course coordinator.

The student will be evaluated by the instructor for passing of the practical portions of the class, according to the standards in the test, handouts, and lecture. There are several quizzes throughout the class and a final written and practical test, minimum passing score will be 80%.

CORE - SENIOR SEMINARS

SENIOR SEMINAR - A Core Curriculum Requirement

"The traditions of the liberal arts and the Benedictine character of our two colleges emphasize the need to develop in our students an ability to lead responsible lives in a contemporary world. This concern has always been a central element in notions about striving for a 'good life,' leading a life of civic responsibility, a life of personal integration, a life of 'wholeness.' At the junior/senior level of the curriculum, this objective implies that explicit and focused attention be paid to developing the ability to make good moral judgments on issues that affect our lives. Developing this ability is, then, the goal of this program. By 'good moral judgments' we understand choices which are consciously elected and defensively maintained."

A second goal is to enhance, "the ability of students to think well about problems that resist easy solutions, problems that call for combining many separate resources and skills, both intellectual and personal."

"The aim of the program is to develop these skills:

- An understanding of the role that empirical information plays in justifying moral judgment
- An ability to sort relevant from irrelevant data
- An understanding of relationships
- An ability to assess the cogency of arguments
- An appreciation of the implications of claims
- An ability to analyze concepts
- An appreciation of and ability to use contextual thinking
- An ability to imagine vividly the impact of events and decisions upon the needs, perceptions, and desires of others
- An appreciation of emotions in the decision making process
- An ability to identify and assess normative components of issues
- An ability to clarify the relationship between an issue and one's own values"

"Issues and concerns around and through which these abilities are developed must be pertinent and persistent in the lives of both students and professors. They should be issues which broaden and deepen the scope of our concern, that increase our consciousness of connections between our lives and the rest of the world." *Taken from Exploring the Human Condition.*

CORE 390-01A: How Do We Know Who We Are?

Nathanael Hauser 1-3-5 / 9:40-10:50 / SJU

"So many of the questions that define us as a culture have been raised through and by the art of recent decades, that without coming to terms with our art, we can scarcely understand ourselves."—Arthur C. Danto, Columbia University.

In an increasingly visual culture, the ability to communicate through the visual arts is imperative. Students, in this class, will engage artists of the past and present in asking what constitutes a good and moral society. The class emphasis will be on discussion and "conversation" with art works that often raise difficult questions concerning the values of a culture. Students will have the opportunity to research questions of interest, present individual or small group projects and open their analysis to various media including gallery, film, television, and performance arts.

CORE 390-02A: Understanding Race Relations in a Multicultural Society

Funghshoutou Lo 1-3-5 / 11:20-12:30 / CSB

This course will use the topic as a means to help students focus on ethical questions. Students will encounter such questions as: Where do my basic ethical beliefs come from? How do my ethical beliefs affect what I say and do as I live my life in the world? How can I reconcile my own ethical system with those of others? How can people with different ethical values live in a multicultural society?

Through such questions this course will encourage students to criti-

cally examine the impact of race relations in the political, social, educational and economic systems of the United States. Students will be asked to evaluate how family traditions, religion beliefs and the mass media are influencing the way we view race relation in American society.

CORE 390-03A: Community Living in America Today

David Rothstein 1-3-5 / 2:40-3:50 / SJU

This course explores the ethical, ecological and spiritual dimensions of community living in America today. Students will study current intentional communities around the country and critically examine their own ethical priorities related to future lifestyle choices.

CORE 390-04A: Ethical Issues & Controversies in the Social Sciences

Jan Holtz 2-4-6 / 1:00-2:10 / CSB

This course is designed to help students integrate ideas and principles gained throughout their college career and apply them to ethical issues. The student will be asked to discriminate between personal and societal values and professional ethical codes of content which often appear, on the surface, to be at variance with each other.

CORE 390-05A: Communal Identity and the Moral Life

David Cloutier 2-4-6 / 2:40-3:50 / CSB

For much of the last few centuries, moral thought in the West focused on the individual and was concerned with methods for individuals confronting moral decisions. However, recent work in ethics has turned its attention to the way in which communal identity/identities and commitments shape our approach to the moral life. Individuals do not face moral decisions as abstract, generic agents, but as whole persons formed by gender, class, religious tradition, family, professional education, nationality, etc. This class will explore this centrality of communal formation and practice for the moral life, with particular attention paid to (1) the ways in which communities of practice provide us with stories of what a good life is, (2) the tensions between communal identity and the values of Western individualism, (3) the problems and possibilities of a multiplicity of overlapping communal identities, and (4) the particular challenges of religious identity in a secular world.

CORE 390-06A: Ethics and Economies of Sustainable Societies

Joseph Desjardins Monday / 6:30-9:30 p.m. / CSB

In this course, we analyze the ethical and economic underpinnings of current industrial societies, critique them, and suggest a different foundation for sustainable societies. The purpose of the course is to decide if societies, such as ours, are sustainable (after we understand the idea) and suggest what a sustainable society could be.

CORE 390-07A: Living Well in Our Bodies: Ethical Issues of Sex and Gender

Sheila Nelson Monday / 6:30-9:30 p.m. / CSB

How do individuals and societies determine whether sexual behaviors and gendered behaviors are right or wrong, good or bad? How do we decide whether certain sexual and gendered identities are acceptable and appropriate? What cultural beliefs form the basis for our attitudes toward sexuality and gender? What does it mean to be at home in our own bodies and to celebrate our sexuality in ways that are freeing and life-affirming? In a society where sexuality is both flaunted and condemned but rarely discussed openly and candidly, what guidelines and values should underlie our personal decisions and our collective norms? This seminar explores these questions using a variety of sources: novels, current social science literature on gender and sexuality, and religious and philosophical writings. Students are invited to critically examine personal and societal assumptions, and to develop over the course of the semester the tools to help them deal effectively with these questions.

CORE 390-08A: Integrity within the Organization: Making Moral Judgments

Jane Kathman Monday and Wednesday / 4:00-5:30 / SJU

This course is designed to question our thinking about integrity in organizational as well as in personal terms. What ethical issues are you likely to face in organizations? How will these issues challenge your personal values? The culture, policies, norms, and incentives within organizations play an important role in shaping behavior and in determining whether individuals make ethically sound decisions as they go about their work. We will discuss a wide range of ethical dilemmas that confront us as we attempt to lead responsible lives in organizations.

CORE 390-09A: Does Gender Matter in Moral and Ethical Thinking?

Charles Thornbury Tuesday and Thursday / 6:30-8:00 p.m. / SJU

This course investigates the moral and ethical implications of our conceptions of gender roles of males and females. A selection of themes will give us meeting points: the gendered classroom; gendered religion and monasteries; war; capital punishment; work and the workplace; and love, sex, and friendship.

CORE 390-10A: Do Animals Have Rights?

Elizabeth Wurdak Tuesday and Thursday / 6:30-8:00 p.m. / CSB

In this class we shall examine the case for animal rights through readings, film, discussion, debate, site visits and reaction papers.

CORE 390-11A: Expanding Awareness and Consciousness (without drugs!)

Leigh Dillard Wednesday / 6:30-9:30 p.m. / CSB

This course examines these questions:

- Who determines what is right, just, moral?
- How do we integrate reflection, critical thinking, and analysis to make ethical decisions personally as individuals?
- How do those personal decisions affect/relate to being in community and the common good?

by FIRST examining how our belief-systems determine our perception of reality/truth/ourselves and shape our values/biases/blindspots.

The course explores different ways of thinking and knowing from a variety of perspectives (e.g., somatics, psychology, neuro-science, the arts) and includes an experiential component combining meditation, the Feldenkrais Method, creative movement and play. The goal is to increase self-awareness through deepened methods of reflection and to strengthen critical thinking through complex and challenging experiences and discussions.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

CSCI-317: Artificial Intelligence

This course is a survey of both the philosophical and technological sides of Artificial Intelligence. It will examine what is currently being done in expert systems, vision and language programming, game playing, and other areas of AI; it will cover the implementation of algorithms which solve problems in ways that would be considered intelligent if they were done by humans; it will also study the philosophical controversies surrounding AI.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

ENVR 150: Introduction to Environmental Studies

Interdisciplinary introduction to environmental studies. Case-based investigation of environmental issues combining perspectives from the social sciences, natural sciences, and humanities. Topics will vary but may include such subjects as endangered species, air/water pollution, environmental justice/racism, animal rights, global warming, ecotourism, agriculture, nature writing, campus ecology, and others.

The objective of this course is to serve as an introduction to the field of Environmental Studies by familiarizing students with the range of interdisciplinary approaches via a series of case studies. Students will learn to critically assess the impacts of human actions on the environment, to understand the value of interdisciplinary study and will achieve the basic familiarity with current environmental issues needed to continue in the program and to be well-informed citizens. Students will also examine their own lifestyle choices and become aware of their impacts on the local, national, and global environments.

ENVR 175: Integrated Environmental Science I

An interdisciplinary introduction to the science underlying environmental issues. This course will focus on the principles of chemistry and geology and in their application to environmental problems. Laboratory experiences will involve exercises and experiments that engage students in the process of science, including design of experiments, analysis and presentation of quantitative data, and written and oral communication

HISTORY

HIST 200: Sophomore Colloquium: The History of Saint John's University and the College of Saint Benedict

Annette Atkins

Our two institutions are located within several historical contexts: the history of Minnesota, of religious orders, of education, of America, of gen-

der. In addition, both SJU and CSB have their own development and history jointly and separately. Through extensive reading and original research we will explore these various rich topics together. This class is designed for probably history majors and intends to draw students into "doing" rather than "receiving" history. Much of the work will be hands on in a seminar format. Our readings will include Fr. Colman Barry, *Worship and Work* (about SJU), S. Grace McDonald, *With Lamps Burning* (about CSB) and *With Hearts Expanded* by S. Carol Berg, S. Emmanuel Renner, S. Evin Rademacher and S. Olivia Forester, (about CSB). We will plan to work, in addition, among primary documents in the archives of both institutions.

HIST 300-01A: Civil Rights **William Green**

This course will examine central topics that contributed to the development of civil rights for African Americans, the interrelationship between social custom and the social contract, and tension between race, ethnicity and class.

HIST 300-02A: History of India **Staff**

See new course description on the History Website under Fall 2003 Courses.

HIST 389-01A: Historiography and Methods **Annette Atkins**

This section of HIST 389 is designed for Social Science majors who are Secondary Education minors.

This course has multiple goals. At the most basic level, it is intended to make you more familiar with the history of the United States over the last 50 years, but it also raises the issue of historiography, or how the story of these decades has evolved as different people have shaped the narrative. Finally, it is designed to increase your readiness to teach High School History. My hope is that you will leave this course with more confidence in your ability to lecture and lead discussion, and with some new ideas on how to make the recent past exciting for the students you will soon be teaching.

HIST 389-02A: Historiography and Methods **Brian Larkin**

Communities of the Conquered, Communities of Resistance: The Nahua under Colonial Rule

Students will investigate the complex processes through which the Mexican Nahua, a politically diverse group of indigenous communities who shared the same language, transformed themselves from 1519-1820 under the pressure of Spanish colonization. Topics will include changing forms of social and political organization, religious practice, identity formation, and gender roles. As students explore the history of the Nahua, they will also be introduced to different types of historical analysis. Students will examine the basic premises and modes of argumentation of a variety of historical schools. Evaluation will be based on discussion, oral presentations, and written book reviews.

HONORS

HONR 210: Evolution of Scientific Thought **Clayton Gearhart**

In this course we will study science in its historical context by examining two quite different "scientific revolutions", those associated with Copernicus and Einstein. The Copernican revolution resulted, by the time of Newton, in a complete reformulation of the principles of both physics and astronomy. The second revolution, associated with Einstein, is still taking place, and has drastically reshaped our notions of space, time, gravity, and matter. The course will examine these two scientific revolutions, and in the process will discuss in an historical context how science operates (the "scientific method"), and the nature of scientific development and change. We will also discuss the relation of science and the rest of society, and see, for example, that science has strong connections to such subjects as philosophy, literature, and religion. In this context we will examine the trial of Galileo in detail, and examine the importance of such "sciences" as astrology and alchemy and how they affected science and western thought generally.

Texts will include Thomas Kuhn's {Structure of Scientific Revolutions}, Stillman Drake's {Discoveries and Opinions of Galileo}, Richard Westfall's {Essays on the Trial of Galileo} and Banesh Hoffmann's biography of Einstein, {Albert Einstein, Creator and Rebel}. Course requirements will include papers, essay midsemester and final exams (open book), occa-

sional reports, and a laboratory.

HONR 230: Theater Audience **Kaarin Johnston**

A presentation of theater from the audience's rather than the performer's perspective. Designed to acquaint non-theater students with live theater as a meaningful and enjoyable event. Approached from the student's present exposure level. Lecture, group discussions and field trips to live performances required.

Note: Fee required: \$100.00

HONR 240: The Development of the Christian Tradition **David Cloutier**

An introduction to the tradition of thought and life called Christianity, primarily through acquiring a historically-informed familiarity with the ideas and content of Christian scripture. In surveying the scripture, particular attention is paid to the relationship of Israel to Jesus and the early Christians, the basic concepts of Christian belief, and the ethics of the Christian life. Some contemporary interpretive controversies and developments will also be studied. Students will be challenged to think critically about the Christian tradition as a whole, particularly in relationship to other religious traditions and to their own ideas about what Christianity is.

HONR 250: Great Issues (HML) **Anthony Cunningham**

In this course we shall take a careful, spirited look at some enduring, significant philosophical questions and issues. Some of these will include: Do we have any genuine free will? Can religious faith and reason be reconciled? Is a belief in an all-powerful, loving divine being reasonable in a world replete with so much apparent evil? Is there any objective foundation for moral values or are they entirely dependent upon particular cultures or individuals? Do human beings care about anything other than (their own) pleasure? Can we ever have genuine knowledge? Are there any moral absolutes? Is there any single best life for human beings or is a good life defined by each person? A mix of primary and secondary philosophical sources will be used. We shall also use some film and literature. The class format will be discussion-based.

OPEN ONLY TO INCOMING FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

HONR 310: Great Books/Ideas (HMU) **Scott Richardson**

This is a year-long discussion based seminar that concentrates on some of the world's greatest works of literature, philosophy, and intellectual history. Authors may include Aristotle, Augustine, Austen, Biblical writers, Camus, Confucius, Descartes, Dickens, Dostoevsky, Eliot, Faulkner, Freud, Homer, Zora Neale Hurston, Henry James Joyce, Kafka, Kant, Melville, Toni Morrison, Flannery O'Connor, O'Neil, Plato, Sartre, Seneca, Shakespeare, Shaw, Virginia Woolf, and others. Registration is by permission of the instructor only. Interested students should e-mail the instructor. All students in this course purchase a personal library consisting of roughly 100 books, and students are required to read a number of novels and plays during the summer.

HONR 340: Ethics and the Jewish Tradition (JC)

An introduction to the sources of Jewish moral principles (as presented in the narrative and legal portions of the Bible and rabbinic literature) and the relationship of those principles to other Jewish religious concepts. Students will then explore how the classical sources can be used in practical moral problems, including medical decisions, social and business dilemmas, and interpersonal relationships. The course will conclude by examining the unique ethical challenges posed by the events of the Holocaust.

HONR 350: Beauty & Truth, Truth & Beauty **Dennis Beach**

John Keats' "Ode on a Grecian Urn" ends "Beauty is truth, truth beauty,—that is all / Ye know on earth, and all ye need to know." But the history of the relationship of beauty and truth is thornier than this enigmatic line would have us believe. Ever since Socrates suggested in the Republic that perhaps poets should be banned from the just city, for they specialize in fictions or lies and virtue is concerned with truth, philosophy has debated the relationship between beauty and truth, between art and virtue. In the modern age, Immanuel Kant examined the function of judgment especially as exercised in judgments that something is beautiful. How do we understand the seeming universality of a judgment such as "This painting is beautiful" in distinction to judgments of taste, "I like this

painting"? And many thinkers (Elaine Scarry and Martha Nussbaum are contemporary examples) have explored ways in which beauty, especially literature, raises moral questions that transcend the insights that might be distillable from more abstract philosophical puzzles.

The course will study the Western tradition of discourse about the nature of the relationship between beauty and truth. All the above appear as key moments in a long discussion in Western thought about the nature of this relationship. Our method will be simple: to enter, through reading and discussion of these texts in the light of our own experiences of beauty and artistic creation, into this tradition of dialogue ourselves and to become conversant with some of the most powerful arguments in it. Our goal is to become competent participants in this discussion, understanding what has been said before us, and venturing our own thoughtful and critically-reflected-upon ideas about the relation between truth and beauty.

HONR 390: Justice in the 21st Century

Daniel Finn

Few issues are as fundamental to human life as justice: Everyone is in favor of it. Yet few issues are as controversial: justice has widely divergent meanings for different people. This course will examine in detail five rival understandings of justice prevalent in debates today. Students will read two novels, and five philosophical or theological treatments of the notion of justice in our joint efforts to come to grips with what justice means in our lives: personally and on a national and global scale. Like all Senior Seminars, the goal of this course is to improve each student's ability to make good moral judgments.

MANAGEMENT

MGMT 305-01A: Marketing Research

Richard Saucier

This course introduces methods for collecting and analyzing data to solve marketing problems. Topics include research design, secondary and primary data collection, sample design and data analysis.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 321

MGMT 305-02A: Corporate Financial Analysis

Michael Rouse

This course is a mixture of financial theory along with real world applications. The course builds on the concepts of MGMT-331. Students will work in groups analyzing problems faced by actual companies. All analysts will be done using Excel spreadsheets. Topics covered will include financial forecasting, capital budgeting, the cost of capital, capital structure, and long-term financing.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 331

MGMT 305-03A: Personal Finance

Mark Asuzu

This course introduces the student to concepts, tools, and applications of personal finance and investments. It shows the student how to take the first step towards understanding the process of financial planning and the logic that drives it. Special attention will be paid to cash or liquid asset management, the use of open credit, consumer loans, insurance and investment management.

This course will allow the student to accomplish the following:

- Manage the unplanned
- Accumulate wealth for special purchases
- Realistically save for retirement
- Invest intelligently
- Minimize the cost of short-term personal financing.

PREREQUISITE: NONE

MGMT 305-04A: Management Information Systems (MIS)

Karleen Nordquist

Conceptual foundations of MIS, roles of computer-based information systems in organizations, global and ethical issues in MIS, and business application software with an emphasis on database management systems.

PREREQUISITE: MGMT 241

MGMT 380: Applied Strategic Management

Fulfills the experiential learning requirement for management majors. This course is designed as a management practicum to reinforce the link between strategic theories and application of the theories. Students enrolled in this practicum will meet periodically in a classroom setting to share their common experiences. Students will set up their own practicums early in the semester and will write a summary paper on their

practicums as a final project. Students can choose from a menu of practicums including: volunteer service learning commitments, campus organizational leadership positions, and community work with managerial responsibilities.

PREREQUISITE: Senior Management Major

MATHEMATICS

MATH 114-01A & 02A: Math Exploration

Robert Hesse

Mathematical Modeling via Discrete Dynamical Systems

This course is an introduction to the theory and application of dynamic modeling, that is the modeling of situations over time. In particular we will study Population Dynamics, Economics, Drug Dosages, and Financial models using this Theory.

MATH 340: Computational Number Theory

Number Theory is one of the oldest and most beautiful branches of mathematics. Not only that, the problems in number theory that we study are understandable to most people and not just mathematics students. Basically, number theory is the study of the integers and their properties.

One basic property of the positive integers is the distinction between the primes and the composites. Several questions we will examine in the course are: How do we find primes? How do we determine if a number is prime? If we pick a number at random, what is the chance that it is prime? The second of these questions is not as simple as it first appears. It is easy enough to check if a number is prime by dividing it by all numbers less than it. If none go in evenly, then it is prime. However this approach is not that easy when the number is very large (15 digits or 40 digits or 150 digits or more). It would take too much time to do all of these divisions, so we need a quicker approach. In the course we will look at several techniques of testing large numbers to see if they are prime, and if we find they are composite, we will learn techniques to use to try to factor them.

For centuries, number theory was thought to be a very enjoyable and beautiful area of study but lacking in any practical applications. Over the last 30 years this has changed drastically. Number theory now has many uses, particularly related to computer science. It is now used for file compression, for arithmetic of large integers, and for the generation of pseudo-random numbers. Perhaps the most important use is in the area of cryptology. We will examine how number theory can be used to permit safe and secret communication between parties who haven't met before. For example, we will learn a method to flip a coin fairly over the telephone or by e-mail when neither party trusts the other.

Number theory is a rare branch of mathematics. You will be able to explain what you are studying to your parents or roommate in ordinary English and they will understand you. It is also exciting because it is an active area of research and we will be examining new results. The course will cover several new results discovered in the last half dozen years. Very few undergraduate mathematics courses include such recent mathematics.

MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES

FREN 351: French Comedy and Social Criticism

In this course we examine comic literature in its relation to social commentary, from medieval farce to contemporary film. We will study how authors have used irony, exaggeration, sarcasm, and parody in different periods of French political and cultural history. Social criticism at times had to be masked in order for authors to avoid censure, exile or death, and comedy was a useful tool. Works like *La Farce de Maitre Pathelin*, *Tartuffe*, *Candide*, *Zazie dans le metro*, *Stupeur et tremblements*, and even *Le Diner de cons* show the potential of the comic to improve society, casting the court jester or other marginal figure in the role of "truth-teller." They also help us examine the limits of humor as constructive force. What are the risks of mockery and burlesque humor, often markers of exclusion, violence or poor taste? How do we explain a culture that prides itself on sophistication yet loves Jerry Lewis? Assignments are carefully designed to meet the needs of students of different backgrounds (writing assistance available prior to each essay). HMU, gender and discussion flags pending.

PREREQUISITE: 311

SPAN 355: The Quest for Spanish Identity

The identity crisis that Spain experienced at the end of the XIX Century is one that has never subsided. 1898 marks a critical time in Modern Spain: the end of the Spanish Empire and authors like Antonio Machado,

Azorin, Miguel de Unamuno, Pio Baroja, and Valle-Inclan question the true nature of Spain. These writers, among others, start questioning the nature of the Spanish identity, the state of the empire, and the future of the nation and its people. Questions that marked an entire generation then continue to be asked today.

The purpose of this course is look into how these authors grapple with these issues and relate them to how Spaniards see themselves at the beginning of the XXI Century.

PREREQUISITE: At least an upper-division course in literature or civilization.

MUSIC

MUSC 233: Orchestra

Performance of a wide range of orchestral music from symphonic to chamber. Repertoire to be chosen mainly from the standard orchestral literature. Audition required. The objective of the course is to give an orchestral performance in a college setting.

NURSING

NRSG 206 01A: Know Thyself

Judy Knutson

This course focuses on self in relationship to cultural beliefs and practices. Students will reflect upon personal beliefs and attitudes of people from other cultures. Ethnocentrism will be explored as a barrier to cultural competence. Students will begin to examine similarities and differences in individualistic and collectivist societies. NRSG 206 02A Learning Culture through the Arts

NRSG 206 02A: Learning Culture Through the Arts

LuAnn Reif

This course is designed to expand the student's understanding of the cultural aspects of health necessary for professional nursing. Emphasis is placed on exploring media and the arts, including photography, novels and art displays/museums to enable a student to experience culture(s) and its values and beliefs in a different venue.

NRSG 206 03A: Russian Immigrant Health

Laura Rodgers

Russian health care practices & application to nursing practice in the U.S.

Students will explore the health care practices and beliefs of people living in the Russian Far East. Using this information, students will develop an understanding as to how insights of current health care practices of Russians can assist U.S. nurses to provide culturally competent care to immigrants from the former Soviet Union. Students will also learn how the cultural, political, and historical background of Russian immigrants affects their health care practices in the U.S.

NRSG 206 04A: To be announced

PEACE STUDIES

PCST 352: Race, Ethnicity and Justice

This course will examine race as a source of conflict and violence, nonviolent approaches to the transformation of race conflicts, and the meanings of justice and peace in racialized societies. We will study the process of racialization, race formations, racism and its effects, white supremacy and white privilege, and anti-racist movements. We will use a variety of theoretical approaches, such as critical race theory, post-colonial theory, and multiculturalism, to analyze historical and contemporary race conflicts and race relations.

PCST 368-71A: Justice, Peace & Reconciliation

Cross-listed with CORE 369-71A

From the Book of Exodus to the Hebrew prophets and the New Testament, one finds the utopian vision of a just, peaceful and reconciled world, summarized in the biblical term "shalom." Through the study of biblical texts and contemporary writings, we will explore the Judeo-Christian tradition's vision of justice, peace and reconciliation. Through the analysis of case studies we will explore how individuals, organizations and communities in the tradition are working to bring about shalom in various parts of the world through such means as nonviolent action, the

defense of human rights, methods to conflict resolution and transformation, and efforts for peacebuilding and reconciliation.

PHILOSOPHY

PHIL 368-01A: Special Topics: Morality & Human Nature

Charles Wright

Humans have wondered about the basis of human morality since the beginning of recorded history. Some have argued that human morality is innate, a kind of "moral instinct;" others that it is a product of society; yet others that it is based on human rationality. Typically these three perspectives have been thought to be mutually exclusive and in competition with one another. This class will consider whether they might actually be compatible. For this purpose, we will study writings from several sources. One will be the tradition of evolutionary ethics, whose advocates suggest that human morality is at least in part the product of natural selection. Humans with a certain propensity for fair play, the argument goes, are more likely to survive and reproduce than those lacking this propensity. But evolution is also a cultural process. So we will also be reading the works of philosophers and social theorists who examine how moral values have evolved over time. Finally, we'll also consider basic philosophical investigations into the rational roots of morality. By integrating all three perspectives on morality, we'll be able to develop a robust understanding not only of how humans are "naturally" moral animals, but also of how it is possible for humans to behave badly as often as we do.

PHIL 368-02A: Philosophy of Jean-Paul Sartre

Rene McGraw

Jean-Paul Sartre, 1905-1980, like his contemporary, Albert Camus, worked in both the literary and philosophical world. Like Camus he wrote novels, plays, essays on literature, and more strictly philosophical works. His essays and philosophical works span some of the most important currents of thought of the twentieth century—from existentialism to Marxism. His literary works, unlike Camus' major literary works, sometimes become a showcase for his philosophy. This course will concentrate on his philosophical works, especially *Being and Nothingness*, but will also look more briefly at some of his literary works. Two exams. One final paper. Daily short writing.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

PHED 150: Introduction to Sports Medicine

This course is designed to introduce students to a broad range of careers in Sports Medicine – including but not limited to Athletic Training, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Exercise Science, Personal Trainer, and Industry and Corporate Health. Students will have the opportunity to explore the various needs for the careers. This course serves as a foundation for further courses in the Sports Medicine minor. Open to minors and non minors.

PHED 207: Sports Injuries

Students will gain a basic understanding of anatomy, while learning concepts and techniques involved in the prevention, care, treatment, evaluation and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. Practical labs are done in class as well as lecture. Fee of \$20. Fall and Spring. Meets requirement for coaching certification and Sports Medicine minor.

PHED 210: Sports Emergency Care

The student will gain basic understanding of the Sports Medicine Team, its roles, its responsibilities, and emergency techniques necessary to provide basic care for acute sport related injuries or illnesses. Open to minors and non minors.

PHED 257: Principles of Resistive Training

Learn the principles of resistance training and how to apply them in designing resistance training programs. Learn and manipulate the variables of program design within individual and environmental constraints, in order to best meet various training goals. This is primarily a lecture and discussion base course with some lab requirement.

PHED 306: Kinesiology

Examine the anatomical and biochemical fundamental concepts that influence human movement. Develop the ability to integrate and apply these fundamentals to human movement.

PREREQUISITE: BIOL 214

will be considered from this culturally deterministic perspective.

PHED 308: Exercise Physiology

Study of body processes and exercise; efficiency of muscle work, fatigue and exercise, age, sex and body types as related to exercise; nervous control of muscle activity and effect of exercise on the circulatory system.

PREREQUISITE: BIOL 214

PHYSICS

PHYS 364: Space Physics

Space physics is the study of the plasma environment that fills the solar system. The course will begin with an introduction to plasma physics, then cover the solar wind and the magnetosphere. Other topics covered will include space weather, the aurora, and the magnetospheres of the other planets in the solar system.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POLS 326: Topics in Law

This year's topic for Political Science 326 will be "Law, Literature, and Interpretation." We will discuss various styles of interpretation used in law, such as original intent, and compare them to theories of interpretation in literature. We will investigate the Law and Literature movement, and try out our own interpretations on works such as *The Merchant of Venice* or *Measure for Measure*. Please note the odd schedule. This schedule will allow me to split the class of 28 into two sections and to run each as a separate seminar of 14. Once you are assigned to a section you will not be allowed to switch back and forth, though rarely I may choose to have them both meet on the same day. Seminars depend on discussion, which is a graded activity. There also will be plenty of good reading to discuss, some writing (and exams only if it becomes clear that the reading isn't being done). There is no prerequisite for this course other than a healthy interest in the law and a taste for literature.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYC 311: Sports Psychology

The scientific study of the behavioral, affective, and cognitive reactions of participants and spectators to various sport settings, with emphasis on the potential of sport to contribute to psychological health and well being, as well as the potential for sport to increase anxiety, aggression, violence, and injury. The role of the sports psychologist is examined, including increasing the level of athletic performance, dealing with the emotional problems of athletes, educating athletes, coaches, and spectators, and studying human behavior and mental processes in sports settings.

PREREQUISITE: 111.

PSYC 393: Psychology and the Environment:

Oskamp (2000) writing in the flagship journal, *American Psychologist*, stated "[u]rgent changes to human lifestyles and cultural practices are required for the world to avoid ecological disaster, and psychologists should lead the way in helping people adopt sustainable patterns of living" (p. 496). The purpose of this senior seminar is to examine psychology's role in leading society toward a more sustainable existence. Applying a psychological perspective to environmental issues will enable course participants to take an integrative look at many aspects of human psychology including ethics, learning, the role of the media, development, social, abnormal, organizations, and health. The course will also provide an opportunity to display the critical thinking and writing skills developed during your liberal arts education here.

SOCIOLOGY

SOCI-337-01A: ENVIRONMENTAL SOCIOLOGY

James Makepeace

The purpose of this course is to examine the linkages between human social behavior and the natural environment. The insights, or lack thereof, of major classical thinkers about the human/environment linkage will be considered as will be pertinent applications of the human ecology, social movement, critical, systemic, and social constructionist traditions. The major premise of the course is cultural determinism--that features of human culture, such as norms and institutional arrangements, are principle determinants of the impact of humans on the natural environment and vice versa. Problematic aspects of major natural areas and processes

This course will explore how race, class and gender organize and impact social life. That is, we will learn how to think sociologically about issues of race, class, and gender. The course will be organized according to a reader (rather than a traditional textbook) that includes various articles applying significant concepts of race, class, and gender to contemporary society. We will begin by shifting our focus to the lives of people who often do not occupy the center of our thought. Once we become comfortable with this new focus, we will offer a basic conceptual approach to race, class, and gender. Following this discussion, we will be able to explore how race, class, and gender influence the organization of different social institutions, which, in turn, influence group experiences. We will also analyze contemporary social issues in the context of race, class, and gender. We will conclude the course by discussing social change and how we can make a difference in our communities.

SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

DOCT 468: Arts, Theology & Spirituality

Frank Burch Brown

Explores how the arts can engage us spiritually and theologically, both in church and culture at large. Historical and contemporary artistry (music, architecture, visual arts, film, literature); readings from theologians, artists, and theorists.

MONS 468: Celtic Monasticism

Mary Forman, OSB

The Lives of Saints Brigit, Brendan, Columba and Columbanus are a small part of the traditions that comprise the beginnings of Celtic monasticism, from its origins in Ireland to its spread on the continent. The course will examine the documents, culture, history and theology of such works as the penitentials, vitae, Irish Biblical Apocrypha, rules, the Stowe Missal, and the Book of Kells among others. The study of famous Celtic monasteries like Iona, Bangor, Luxeuil and St. Gall will reveal that the monks not only produced fine manuscripts, but also greatly facilitated education, encouraged practices of prayer and enhanced pilgrimages as a way of Christian devotion.

PTHM 468: Conflict Management (WEB)

James Radde

NO CAMPUS

Conflict is normal in all relationships. Every adult has some tools for handling conflict. Yet many find dealing with conflict a major challenge at work, at home and elsewhere. It is common for a person in a conflict to wish she were more skilled. "Tools for Managing Conflict Peacefully" offers an opportunity to: be affirmed in what you already do well, become more self-aware around your personal conflict style, learn conflict management skills which can be put to use immediately, practice and review both old and new skills. Online presentations, readings, journaling, assignments in connection with individual goal-setting and reporting on experiences of conflict, and communications with the instructor make up the course.

SPIR 468: Arts, Theology & Spirituality

Frank Burch Brown

Explores how the arts can engage us spiritually and theologically, both in church and culture at large. Historical and contemporary artistry (music, architecture, visual arts, film, literature); readings from theologians, artists, and theorists.

CORE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of the Core Curriculum is to provide students with a foundation and the intellectual tools necessary to examine the fundamental, recurring questions about ourselves and our world. These questions challenge students to broaden their interests and explore a variety of academic areas. Striving to ask those questions well and make good moral and ethical judgments about them is at the heart of our colleges' mission.

The Core Curriculum is composed of four levels of requirements:

1. Proficiency-based requirements

Foreign language proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in speaking or reading a classical or modern language through satisfactory completion of the language proficiency exam or through satisfactory completion of Modern/Classical Language 211 (with any passing grade).

Mathematics Proficiency

Students demonstrate proficiency in elementary algebra and geometry through satisfactory completion of the mathematics proficiency exam or calculus readiness exam.

First Year Students beginning Fall 2001 must complete the Fine Arts Experience requirement by attending 8 designated Fine Arts Experience Events—four events per semester.

2. Cross-Disciplinary courses

First-Year Symposium (2 courses)-- CORE 100 & 101, or HONR 100 & 101

Senior Seminar--CORE 390, or HONR 390 only. Education majors can complete EDUC 390 and SWRK majors can complete SWRK 390. Ordinarily completed during Senior year. Cannot be repeated for credit. Both semesters of First-Year Symposium must already be completed.

3. Disciplinary courses

Only courses which are designated within the course title by the appropriate symbol (FA, HML, MT, JC, etc) may be used to complete the following disciplinary requirements.

- FA (4 credits) Must be from courses that are designated as fulfilling Fine Arts
- HML (2 courses) Must be from different departments or disciplines (ex. Not two literature courses even if they are from different department)
- TH (1 course) Must be 100 level theology course.
- HMU (1 course) Must be from the same discipline as one HML or TH already completed. Cross listed courses only fulfill either the HMU or the JC, but not both disciplinary requirements.
- JC (1 course) May be satisfied only after the TH and one HML course is completed. Cross listed courses only fulfill either the HMU or the JC, but not both disciplinary requirements.
- MT (1 course) Must have satisfied the Math Proficiency before the completion of the course.
- NS (2 courses) Must be from different departments (unless NATS, COLG, HONR or ENVR).
- SSL (1 course) Must be 100 level.
- SSU (1 course) Must have completed the SSL course first.

4. Flagged courses

Courses may carry 1 or more flags, in addition to meeting Core disciplinary or Major requirements. Flagged courses are specific to the instructor and term. Flagged courses are listed in the Class Schedule and updated lists are posted at the Office of the Registrar.

Writing Flag (2 courses) Must have completed both semesters of First-Year Symposium.

Discussion Flag (1 course) Must have completed both semesters of First-Year Symposium.

Gender Perspectives (1 course)

Global Perspectives (1 course)

Quantitative Reasoning (1 course) Must have satisfied Math Proficiency before completing the course.

COMM 103: Mass Media & Society (HML), 4 credits

MATH 124: Probability & Statistics (MT), 4 credits

MUSC 380: Art of the Organ, 1 credit

Faculty Moderator - Kim Kasling

BIOL 331: Biology of the Pacific Northwest, 4 credits

Faculty Moderator - Gordon Brown and Larry Davis

A month-long summer field course emphasizing the study of mountain ecosystems in the Northern Rockies and marine tidal environments on the Olympic Peninsula of Washington.

Prerequisites: BIOL 115 and 116.

COLG 280: Economic Development and Social Change in China, 2 credits

Faculty Moderator - John Hasselberg

Students will experience and learn about Chinese societal and economic development issues through a one month immersion in Southeast Chinese culture. The course will include travel to Hong Kong, Shenzhen, Dongguan, Guangzhou, Zhanjiang, Xuwen, and Hainan Island, two major seminars taught by CSB/SJU and Zhanjiang faculty members, supporting seminars in Intercultural Communication, Chinese language, Chinese history, Chinese culture, and Chinese Gongfu, visits to historic sites, and a Chinese host family experience.

Approximate Fee for trip: \$2,975

COLG 280: Berlin and Munich Arts and Ideas, 1 credit

Faculty Moderator - Mark Thamert

Perhaps no other city in the world gives witness so vividly to historical ideological movements and clashes as the city of Berlin. This course will introduce students to the art, architecture, music and intellectual history of four historical moments in the life of the city: 1) The Baroque; 2) the Rise of National Socialism 3) East German Communism, and 4) the Triumph of German Reunification and the Unification of Europe. In the final days of the seminar, the group will travel to Munich to compare its art and architecture with those of Berlin.

Approximate Fee for trip: \$2,200

COLG 280: New York Music and the Arts, 1 credit

Faculty Moderators - Robert Koopmann and David Paul Lange

This course will focus on music and artistic events which are available in New York City during the time from May 14 through May 22. The events will include concerts, opera, art exhibits, a musical, a play, architectural tour. There will be three classes on campus during the 2003 Spring Semester. While in New York City, there will be lectures at the art museums and other classes given by the instructors.

Approximate Fee for trip: \$1,225

GEOL 302: Geology of the Colorado Plateau II, 3 credits

Faculty Moderator - Larry Davis

A summer field course emphasizing a study of the distinctive geologic features of the Colorado Plateau, featuring the national parks and monuments of the "Grand Staircase": Grand Canyon NP, Zion NP, Grand Staircase-Escalante NM, and Bryce Canyon NP. Arches, Canyonlands, Capitol Reef, and Petrified Forest National Parks will also be visited.

Prerequisites: GEOL 301 and good physical conditioning.

GEOL 360: Sedimentology and Stratigraphy, 3 credits

Faculty Moderator - Larry Davis

Sedimentary rocks illuminate many of the details of Earth's 4.6-billion year history, such as sea level changes, global climatic change, and fluctuations in the bio-geochemical cycles. Sedimentology is the study of the origin, classification and diagenesis of sediments, sedimentary rocks, and the sedimentary structures. Stratigraphy emphasizes the analysis of sedimentary strata and the interpretation of ancient sedimentary depositional environments.

POLS 396: Washington DC Internship, 8 credits
