CORE 390-13A SENIOR SEMINAR: SOCIAL ISSUES

James Makepeace

The focus of this senior seminar will be a synthetic examination of four social issues which have recently come to the forefront of public and scholarly attention: terrorism, globalization, treatment of animals, and the environment. Greatest attention will be given to the environmental issue. Each issue will be examined in a two-fold manner: *objective assessment* utilizing scientific evidence and theory and *normative assessment* utilizing tools of ethical theory. Aspects of each social issue to be considered will include: conditions of emergence, theories, applicable social movements and counter-movements, cross-cultural aspects, and social change.
