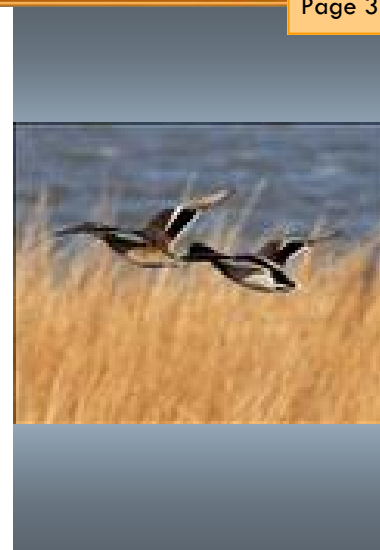

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

### COMM 381G-01A: Rhetoric of Popular Culture

*Zitlow Rogness*

This course uses various rhetorical theories and perspectives to analyze popular culture, with a particular focus paid to the importance of communication in the production of social reality and the consumption of culture. We will examine various artifacts of popular culture including music, movies, texts, advertisements, clothing, and other relevant artifacts. In the course of this exploration, we will study the rhetorical construction/production of social reality by applying different theories or 'lenses' to these artifacts.

### CORE 390-09A: Senior Seminar: Business Ethics

*Jean Ochu*

Is business ethics an oxymoron? If you read newspaper articles that describe corporate misconduct and felonious behavior by corporate executives your conclusion would be yes. We will examine the ethical choices individuals must inevitably make in their business and professional lives. We will examine ethical philosophical concepts that are relevant to resolving moral issues in business. We will identify the moral issues involved in specific problem areas of business and determine the reasoning needed to apply ethical concepts to business decisions. Business ethics has an interdisciplinary character. We will examine issues in politics, sociology, economics, environment, and social justice. This course will be primarily discussion based though the use of case studies and actual moral dilemmas faced by individuals in business.

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS continued

### **PTHM 468-01A: Ministry Through the Life Cycle**

*Barbara Sutton*

Church leaders attend with care to faith growth, challenges, and pastoral care of the entire Christian community. Ministry through the lifecycle is influenced by theology, family systems, social sciences and developmental psychology. This course draws on these resources to examine the way in which we can support the fundamental activity of meaning making for persons of faith at each point of the life cycle. The challenges and tasks associated with each stage will be investigated as well as the role ministry should play at those critical times in one's life. Attention will be given to the lifecycle of the family, family of origin, family systems, and a family perspective to ministry. The course will allow the student to concentrate attention on the periods of development that are of greatest pastoral or personal significance (e.g., adolescence, young adulthood, mid-life, etc.) Attention will also be given to the church leader's own developmental tasks and need for care in relation to the varied demands of care giving.
