COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CORE 390-06A: Race & Justice in American Legal History Eugene Garver

This course will look at the history of racial equality as treated by the U.S. Supreme Court. Primary focus will be the three crucial cases of Dred Scott vs. Sanford, Plessy vs. Ferguson, and Brown vs. Board of Education, but we will also extend the history a bit on both ends, looking at arguments about slavery at the founding of the Constitution, and at cases from the 60 years since Brown. We will try to put the legal history in a wider social context, and look at changing meanings of equality over the last 200 years.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MCLT 315-01A: Chinese Literature in Translation: Folklore & Legen in Chinese & Chinese American Literature Sophia Geng

We read the English translations of popular Chinese folklores, legends, and myths. These include the tale of Mulan, the story of the Water Buffalo Shepherd and the Weaver Goddess, and the legend of Caiji. We analyze how the stories evolved throughout history and how they were told differently in mainstream and vernacular cultures. More interestingly, we examine a number of adaptations of these stories in film, story-telling and writings by Chinese American authors, and compare the differences in terms of language, theme, and function.

VARIABLE CREDIT COURSES


